PROF. AUDU CALLS FOR INNOVATIVE TEACHING, RESEARCH

The Vice- Chancellor, Prof. Muhammed Salihu Audu *FMAN* has called for more innovative style of teaching and research in the University.

Prof. Audu made this call while declaring open a three-day workshop on *Effective Teaching, Learning and Research* for all Schools in FUT, Minna. The event took place at the TETFUND Lecture Theatre, School of Environmental Technology (SET) Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

Represented by the DVC (Academic), Prof. Akim Osunde, who stated that if the mission statement of the University is to be attained, there must be a concerted effort towards innovative style in teaching and learning that would position FUT, Minna staff and students for the high level manpower required for global technological development.

He added that FUT, Minna being one of the top two universities in Nigeria based on the last National Universities Commission (NUC) Institutional Accreditation exercise, cannot afford to slip from the lofty position.

"One of the ways to sustain this excellent accomplishment is to bring up to date the learning community which consists of students and their lecturers through effective methods of teaching, learning new practices and focusing on globally accepted best practices in service delivery," he noted.

In his remark, DVC (Admin), Prof. Abdullahi Bala who said that Management takes staff training seriously and has invested huge sums in the training programme urged participants to take the training exercise seriously.

The programme is geared towards providing theoretical and practical ideas on the fundamental aspects of teaching, learning and research development, as well as ethics of teaching profession for the purpose of achieving the University's mission and vision.

BELARUSIAN TECHNICIANS HAIL FUT, MINNA EQUIPMENT

The Deputy Director, Innovations of UP NTP Centr (a Belarus based firm), Mr. Vasili Harbachou and Mr. Andrei Draka have hailed the state-of-the-art-equipment and facilities at the Central Teaching Laboratories of Federal University of Technology, Minna.

The duo stated this during the installation of equipment and training exercise for FUT, Minna technicians when the DVC (Admin) Prof. Abdullahi Bala who represented the Vice-Chancellor, visited laboratories in the School of Engineering and Engineering Technology with the DVC (Academic) Prof. Akim Osunde on Monday, September 3, 2012.

Mr. Draka who spoke through an interpreter said that the equipment and facilities on ground at the Central Teaching Laboratories are factory made and can last up to 10 years without any technical problems.

Speaking during the tour of equipment, the DVC (Admin) Prof. Bala said that the University has waited for two years for the arrival and intervention of the Belarusians to install and train staff on the use of the equipment.

He solicited for the assistance of the Belarusians in equipment maintenance, and upgrading while urging them to establish a direct contact with FUT, Minna technicians.

Also speaking, the DVC (Academic) Prof. Osunde said that the equipment in the laboratories should be optimally utilized for the purpose of research and learning.

Coordinator, Equipment Maintenance Centre, Mr. Essiet Imeh took the DVCs round the laboratories to inspect the equipment and facilities.

Mr. Imeh who thanked the University Management for the support informed the DVCs that the laboratories are facing the problem of inadequate and low voltage electricity supply to power some of the equipment as well as shortage of manpower.

The Deputy Registrar (Establishment), Hajiya Azumi Ndayako who in her closing remarks appreciated the Registrar for the foresight in organising the training thanked the speakers for their rich presentations and urged the new staff to take their work seriously as they were lucky to be employed.

In a related development, the Clerical Registry Staff were also trained. The Registrar, Mrs. Victoria Kolo who was represented by Deputy Registrar and Secretary, Postgraduate School, Mal. Garba Abdullahi said the Clerical staff play a very crucial role in the University as work cannot move smoothly without them. He urged them to hold their jobs with all seriousness, and avoid distractions such as rumour mongering, gossips and racketeering and to imbibe honesty, integrity, confidentiality, and respect.

The Chief Clerical Officer, Registrar's Office, Mr. Leonard Barde who spoke on the topic "*Knowing and Doing the Clerical Work Perfectly*," elaborated on the functions of the Clerical Officer, Filing System, Communication and Conduct to Visitors.
