HOSTS **BIOMEMS** FUT. **MINNA** WORKSHOP

5-Day workshop on Nanomedicine and Bio-Micro-Electric Mechanical System (BIOMEMS), organized by FUT, Minna Centre of Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology in collaboration with African University of Science and Technology (AUST), Abuja with the support of World Bank STEP-B programme was held recently at CPES Hall, Bosso Campus.

Declaring the workshop open, DVC (Academic), Prof. Akim Osunde, who represented the Vice-Chancellor, Muhammed Salihu Audu, said FUT, Minna has a strong desire for excellence and quality in teaching, research and community services which has been the watchword of the University.

We have made our mark in vaccine development and drug research from natural herbs for the treatment of various

diseases. AUST is developing such capacity in nanotechnology and Bio-Micro Electro-Mechanical systems and its application in medical research cannot be rivalled anywhere in this country and in sub-Sahara *Africa*, he noted.

Prof. Audu also informed participants at the workshop that the University will continue to be at the fore-front of research and technological advancement in line with the institution's mission statement.

President, AUST Abuja, Prof. Wole Soboyejo at the opening session of the workshop delivered a lead paper entitled: Nanoparticles and BioMEMS for Cancer **Detection and Treatment.**

He revealed the various types, causes, and methods through which cancer can be detected.

According to him gold and magnetic particles provide opportunities for early Magnetic Response Images (MRI) detection and treatment of breast and prostate cancer.

"Single cell detection of cancer is not clinical ", he noted and urged participants to conduct cancer test regularly.

Earlier at the workshop, the Project Manager of World Bank Step-B programme, FUT, Minna, Prof. Oladiran Abubakre welcomed participants to the workshop and urged them to pay rapt attention to the various presentations. He also thanked the University management for the immense support towards successful hosting of the workshop.

The workshop had in attendance researchers from AUST, Princeton University, USA and FUT, Minna.
