FUT, MINNA COMMENCES 2013/2014 POST-UTME SCREENING

Federal University of Technology, Minna today commenced the 2013/2014 Pre-Admission Screening Exercise (UPASE), hitherto referred to as Post-Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination at the University Main Campus amidst orderliness.

While inspecting the University Electronic Test Centre (ETC), the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, *FNSBMB*, who was accompanied by other Management staff, commended the Committee for the preparations, orderliness and logistics put in place for the examination.

Prof. Akanji said the computers that would be used for the Computer-Based Test are all in perfect state and expressed optimism that the institution would conduct a hitch free Post-UTME.

In a related development, while addressing journalists who were in the campus to observe the exercise, the DVC (Academic), Prof. Abdullahi Bala said the University recognized the fact that the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) are on strike but the Post-UTME screening exercise is on because admission process is not the responsibility of ASUU.

"Every academic staff has three mandates; teaching, research and community service and ASUU has only withdrawn the teaching component of it", Prof. Bala stated.

On the threat by FUT, Minna Chapter of ASUU that the students would not be recognized if the University proceeds with the Post-UTME, Prof. Bala said the candidates are not yet students of FUT, Minna and ASUU cannot lay claim to them until when they are admitted and matriculated.

He further stated that the Vice-Chancellor is the Chief Admission Officer of the University and has the right to conduct screening and admission as at when due.

He charged journalists to be more responsible in discharging their professional duties.

The Post-UTME will end on the 6th of August, 2013 for candidates who chose FUT, Minna as their first and second choice.

So far, the exercise has been hitch free and about 5,000 candidates are expected to participate in the screening. Mean while, the screening for Direct Entry candidates will commence on the 11th-12th of September, 2013.

PROF. AKANJI CALLS FOR REGIONAL COOPERATION IN EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT

In view of the dwindling fortune of education standard in the country, the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, *FNSBMB*, has advocated for regional cooperation in educational development in Africa.

The VC stated this when he received members of West African Science Service Centre on Climate Change and Adapted Land Use (*WASCAL*), Advisory Board on Monday, July 29, 2013 at the Council Chamber, Main Campus.

Prof. Akanji said regional cooperation through exchange of programmes and experts in various fields would help enhance the standard of education in the country.

The VC said the University recognized WASCAL's impact since its inception and noted that the institution has great respect for international programmes by ensuring that the WASCAL programmes run without interference from the local ones.

"I want to implore you to critically look at the programme and proffer ways that would help improve it and we would be ready to accommodate it," Prof. Akanji requested.

He further assured them of the University Management support and wished the delegation a fruitful deliberation during their meeting.

Speaking earlier, Coordinator, WASCAL FUT, Minna and HOD, Department of Geography, Dr. Appolonia Okhimamhe said FUT, Minna WASCAL proposal has been certified by the Advisory Board for being in tandem with tenets of the regional programme and thanked the University Management for the support given to the programme.

Dr. Okhimamhe informed the VC that the Advisory Board members would critically evaluate the FUT, Minna WASCAL programme and recommend ways on how to improve the programme.

She also said that the University would learn a lot from the input of the WASCAL Advisory Board members owing to their vast experience and knowledge garnered as a result of being associated with the programme across different parts of West Africa

In his vote of thanks, member of the WASCAL Advisory Board, Prof. Omotosho hailed the University Management for the well documented support given to the WASCAL programme and assured the VC that they would perform their duty excellently towards improving the quality of the programme.

Prof. Akanji told the delegation to identify the areas of partnership with the University and assured them of Management's support towards promoting engineering profession in the country.

He also congratulated NSE President, Engr. Hassan Chado on his well deserved appointment as the General Manager of Niger State Water Board and wished him well.

Speaking earlier, the NSE President, Engr. Chado who thanked the VC and his Management team for making out time to receive them, despite their tight schedule said the purpose of the visit was to meet with the University Management and to solicit for strong partnership with the institution through its School of Engineering and Engineering Technology (**SEET**) in the area of workshops, conferences and other areas that would benefit both parties.

He commended the institution for the quality of its engineering graduates which according to him are contributing greatly in various sectors of the country development and urged the VC to support more of its members who are staff of the University in attending workshops that would enhance their skills.

NIGER STATE FRSC COMMAND TRAINS FUT, MINNA DRIVERS

Sequel to the recent courtesy visit of the Niger State Sector Commander of the Federal Road Safety Corps, Mr. David Usman to the institution, FRSC, Niger State Command has organised a one day induction and training session for the University's drivers.

Speaking during the session which was held on Monday, July 29, 2013 at the Works and Maintenance Department, the Sector Commander said the training was aimed at getting the participants acquainted with the process of obtaining the new drivers' license and numbers plate which he said was necessitated by the fact that FRSC did not have an adequate database of drivers on Nigerian roads.

Mr. Usman who elaborated on the procedure of obtaining the new drivers' license and number plate said the maximum speed limit on Nigerian roads is 100km p/h and that everybody should be mindful of whom they release their cars to, as the new number plates are personal to individuals and any crime committed with them will be traced to the owner.

"Most importantly as a driver, always have it at the back of your mind that every other driver is amateur, consider yourself the only normal person on the road." The Sector Commander advised.

Also speaking, the Director of Works, Alhaji Muhammadu Wuna implored the participants to put all that was taught into good use so as not to be found wanting.

In his closing remarks, the Deputy Director of Works, Engr. I. B. Musa, thanked FRSC for the insightful training and assured them that FUT, Minna transport Fleet Management will continue to be a Grade A classified fleet services in Niger State which it is known for.
