It happened yesterday at Reiz Intercontinental Hotel, Abuja where the Nigerian Academy of Science (NAS) inducted him as a Fellow for his outstanding contributions to science. Nine other professors who have distinguished themselves in their areas of study were also inducted as Fellows, Academy of Science (FAS).

Among other contributions, the Academy recognized Prof. Akanji for demonstrating through his works that the source of extra-curricular enzymes can be traced to tissues compromised by chloroquine and for also establishing the potential and safety of Fadogia agrestis, an aphrodisiac.

And it was an elated Vice-Chancellor who spoke with our reporter: "It means a lot to me. It's the pinnacle in one's career, the highest award in science."

The induction brings to 212 the total number of Fellows of the Academy.

Out of the 10 inductees, four were women, making this year's occasion record the highest female inductees so far, which in turn makes the total number of female Fellows in Nigeria 19.

Principal Officers, members of the University Senate and staff were on hand to felicitate with the VC.

OUR CURRICULUM IS DYNAMIC – PROF. AKANJI

cademic programmes in the Federal University of Technology, Minna are run using dynamic a curriculum that meets industry needs, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, has said.

Prof. Akanji who said this on Tuesday, May 10, 2016 when he featured as the guest in an interactive personality platform organized by the Correspondents Chapel of the Nigerian Union of Journalists, Niger State Chapter explained

that the University interfaces with employers of labour and in turn incorporates their needs into the curriculum.

At the forum, which was an avenue for the VC to give a progress report of his stewardship, he stated that the University has newly introduced Mechatronics Engineering, demerged Mathematics and Statistics, just as it was preparing to introduce two new programmes - Educational Technology and Communication Education.

He hinted that Management intended to begin interface with graduates of FUT, Minna at their places of work across the country with a view to getting them involved in the development of the University.

The VC said that he recognized that for alumni to contribute to the institution, they have to be made to fall in love with it, a situation that made his administration fast-track the process of issuing certificates and academic transcripts, resulting in the issuance of certificates at convocation and processing and issuance of transcript within 10 working days.

He pointed out that his administration has increased internet access in the University to 155 megabytes per seconds (mbps), up from 45 mbps which he met in 2012.

In terms of ranking, Prof. Akanji said the University which in 2012 occupied the 28th positing in Nigeria is now ranked 7th out of the 148 universities in the country, 1st among Nigeria's specialized universities and 67th in Africa.

Prof. Akanji stated that the University takes the health and welfare of staff seriously hence the provision of drugs at its clinics and the introduction of comprehensive medical check which he instituted for members of staff to have on their birthdavs.

He hailed the cordial relationship between the University and its host community, just as he noted that FUT, Minna students are generally well behaved.

Challenges faced by the University, according to the VC, include inadequate funding, electricity and water supply. He however added that researchers were working on alternative sources of power and water supply to address the challenge.

PROFFER SOLUTIONS TO CLIMATE CHANGE, PROF. AKANJI URGES FORUM

he Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, **FNSBMB**, has called on the School of Environmental Technology (SET) to deliver groundbreaking papers that will combat the fear of climate change in Nigeria.

He made this call while declaring open the 1st International Conference of the School of Environmental Technology with the theme **"Sustainable Built**

Environment And Climate Change: The Challenge of Post 2015 Development Agenda" which held on Tuesday, May 10, 2016 at the School of Environmental Technology Complex, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

Prof. Akanji said that the Challenges of Climate Change were enormous and it is affecting every facet of human development, leading to a rapid depletion in all areas of human existence. "As people, we are experiencing the side effects of our activities thereby putting a lot of strain on the earth's capacity to provide the resources needed to sustain life," he echoed.

The VC said it was a pleasure to host the first conference of SET saying the School has been of tremendous help to the University especially in the area of the production of a master plan. He also lauded the participation and involvement of the students at the event.

Speaking earlier, the Chairman of the opening session, Prof. Jacob Mundi Baba of the Department of Geography, and former Deputy Vice-Chancellor, FUT, Minna said he was excited to chair the event because a big chunk of his life belongs in FUT, Minna.

Prof. Baba pointed out that the theme of the Conference is an international vocal point of discussion and the issue is of foremost international concern. He said he was proud of the number of erudite scholars who have emerged from the SET while urging everyone present to ensure that solutions were proffered to the problems of climate change.

In his welcome address, the Dean, SET, Prof. Yekeen Sanusi said the focus of the conference was on a subject matter of global concern, which bothers on human settlements, the natural environment and its resources and human welfare.

Prof. Sanusi noted that this is the first conference to be held in the University on the Post 2015 Development Agenda saying the conference is the School contribution to the debate on the issue that a post conference round table discussion would hold with stakeholders in the area of built environment in Niger State.

He expressed his gratitude to the VC and his Management for their support and commended the participants for their efforts.

Delivering the Conference Lecture titled "Integrating Climate Change Adaptation Strategies Into Urban Designs: A Must For Today's Built Environment Professional," Dr. Apollonia Okhimamhe, Director, West African Science Service Centre for Climate Change and Adapted Land use (WASCAL), said human activities like electricity, burning fuel, cars emitting smoke, land use change have contributed negatively to climate change.

While speaking on the strategies, opportunities and challenges in Adapting to Climate Change, Dr. Okhimamhe said for developing countries like Nigeria, the key challenges would be to reduce impact on livelihoods, reduce carbon emissions, generate financial resources for adaptation, while the opportunities created include investment in health and education infrastructures and facilities, noting that in order to implement adaptation measures, stakeholders at the local level must have a clear awareness of local vulnerability to climate change and risks involved.

She went ahead to project that there would be an increase in temperatures over the entire country and an expected increase in the heat especially in the North, which in turn will not only affect the economy and population, but also exacerbate the existing socioeconomic and environmental drivers of risk for the most vulnerable (the elderly, physically challenged and children). She hoped that all deliberations and papers that would be presented at the Conference will help to forestall the future negative effects of climate change.
