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LIBRARY ORGANIZES OPEN ACCESS SEMINAR

n commemoration of the Open Access Week, the University Library Services has organized a one-day Seminar/Interactive Session with the theme "Open Access Publishing: Benefits and Challenges" for members of the University staff.

The event sponsored by the UNESCO and International Network for the Availability of Scientific Publications (INASP) was held on Wednesday, November 2, 2016 at the University Library's Reception Hall, Main Campus.

In his opening remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS, who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Suleiman Sadiku, commended the effort of the University Librarian for organising the interactive session.

He described the Library as the warehouse of the University, saying good teaching and research starts and ends in the library and that the seminar was timely and very dear to the University.

He urged participants to put into good use knowledge gained at the seminar.

Speaking earlier, the University Librarian Dr. Jibril Alhassan said that the seminar was organized to provide staff with concise and accurate information on Open Access. While advising staff to always attach their data to their articles, he exposed them to the dangers of predatory journals and that the library is making efforts to ensure that the list of authentic and good journals are made available to staff.

One of the resource persons, Dr. (Mrs.) Georgina Oyedun of the Department of Library Information Technology (LIT) who spoke on the topic "Open Access and Publications," noted that with the advent of information and communication technology, research outputs are published in either hard or soft copies. The Open Access publishing, she explained, gives free access to research outputs through internet without any restriction such as financial, legal or technical barrier other than those inseparable from gaining access to the internet.

Similarly, Mrs. Fatimah Jibril Abduldayan shared her thoughts on open science in research work. She revealed that the practice of science is that others can collaborate and contribute. Under this practice, research data, laboratory notes and other research processes are freely available under terms that enable reuse, redistribution and reproduction of the research and its underlying data method, subject only, at most, to the requirement to attribute and share alike.

In her paper, Mrs. Sa'adiyat Adetoro Saliu enumerated some of the benefits achievable on research outputs' in open access publishing to include increased visibility of research output and consequently the department and the institution provides the possibility to standardize institutional records such as academics CVs and published papers; allows the creation of personalised publication list and offers usage metrics so researches can determine it rates on specific papers.

In his vote of thanks , the Deputy University Librarian, Mohammed Bitagi thanked the Management for supporting the event.

FUT MINNA HOSTS MSN ANNUAL CONFERENCE

he Mycotoxicology Society of Nigeria (MSN) held its 11th Annual General Conference from the 25th to 28th of October, 2016 at the School of Engineering and Engineering Technology Complex, Federal University of Technology, Main Campus with the theme "Mycotoxin Control in a Changing Climate: A Panacea for Food Security."

In his welcome address, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS, said it was a pleasure to play host to the conference, noting that various societies have been holding their conferences in FUT, Minna because the University has a very good and impressive web presence.

The VC opined that the conference will be a turning point as deliberations would suggest how to avoid mycotoxins in our daily consumption of food and water.

President of the Society, Dr. Anthony Negedu in his speech noted that mycotoxins attract world wide attention because of the significant economic losses associated with their impact on human health, agriculture, food and nutrition, security and trade, saying that tropical conditions such as high temperature and moisture, unseasonal rains during harvest and flash floods lead to fungal proliferation and production of mycotoxins, just as poor harvesting practice, improper storage and bad conditions of transport and marketing can contribute to fungal growth and increase the risk of mycotixin production.

He called on the government, development partners and other stakeholders in the food industry to sincerely show commitment to the prevention and control of these bioactive hazards for the overall betterment of human and animal health.

The keynote speaker Prof. S. E. Atawodi from the Department of Biochemistry, Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, represented by Prof. Hussaini Makun, the Director, Directorate for Research Innovation and Development (DRID) from the FUT, Minna, while speaking on the topic "Relevance of Mycotoxin Control to Food Security in Changing Climate," said mycotixins are secondary fungal metabolites that cause a wide variety of harmful effects in animals and human beings, noting that climate change is a term used to describe the increases in temperature and unpredictability in weather conditions.

He pointed out that mycotixins have wide ranging health and economic impacts and their contamination of food is exacerbated by climate change and some un-intended consequences, including climate change and consumption of mycotixins resulting in food insecurity, poor human health and a lack of virile workforce.

Prof. Atawodi called on the government at all levels to invest adequately and wisely in mycotixin control, since there seems to be an unholy alliance between climate change, mycotixin production and food insecurity to frustrate meaningful national development.

High point of the event was the induction of the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Musbau Akanji into the Mycotoxicology Society of Nigeria as an honorary member.

Secretary to the Kogi State Government, Mrs. Folashade Ayoade attended the Conference among other dignitaries.
