PROF. ONWUKA ADVOCATES FOR INVESTMENT MOBILE CONNECTIVITY FOR INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT

rof. Elizabeth Nonye Onwuka, a Professor of Telecommunications Engineering has called on the federal government to invest massively in mobile connectivity technology, as countries with more number of telephone lines perform economically better than countries that are less connected.

The don who is the pioneer and current Dean, School of Information and Communication Technology (SICT) made the call when she presented the 47th Inaugural lecture of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, with the theme: "Cellular Mobile Communications: Connecting the World and Empowering the People," on Thursday, November 17, 2016 at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus.

The development of Telecommunications into mobile communication technology she said was fueled by the invention of wireless transmitters, which ushered in mobile communication and of all the technological communication systems, the one that has positively impacted the society most is the Mobile communication system.

"Mobile connectivity brings economic empowerment in many dimensions. Besides direct employment by mobile companies and mobile services related businesses (usually called mobile ecosystem), mobile connectivity enhances every other business by bridging distance, reducing the cost of contacts and provides information at cheaper rates. All of this drops the cost of running business and increased profit," she reiterated.

Lamenting that Nigeria is still poorly connected due to high cost of connectivity attributed to many national problems such as electricity power supply, multiple taxation, average individual poverty level etc, she recommended amongst others the laying communication infrastructure such as fibre optic backbone cable all round the country so that mobile operators can tap into it to provide services at affordable prices.

In the course of her lecture, she disclosed that in collaboration with her students, she is presently researching on use of the tool of complex analysis to track criminal from telecom data to aid crime investigators to easily handle criminals without harming innocent citizens or invading their privacies. The data could also be used to study user behaviour with respect to the network and plan and adjust the network to better serve the user.

The lecturer who doubles as the Head of the Department of Telecommunication Engineering, School of Engineering and Engineering Technology (SEET) posited the need for further research in mobile communication system in order to help man enjoy his short stay on earth.

Explaining the genesis of communication Prof. Onwuka said that communication is as old as man himself and that the early men used smoke, fire, signals, beacons, talking drums etc. in disseminating information. The only difference with today's communication is technology.

Prof. Onwuka at the end of her lecture pledged to endow in honour of her late mother, Madam Victoria Onwuka an undisclosed prize to the best graduating student in the Department of Telecommunication Engineering, SEET effective from the next academic session.

In his remark the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS, appreciated the staff, students as well as the general public for the rapt attention during the lecture while looking forward for more of such in the nearest future.

VC PLEDGES TOTAL SUPPORT TO CGEB

he Vice Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Musbau Adewunmi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS, has pledged his moral and financial support to the Center for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology.

The VC stated this on Tuesday, November 15, 2016 at the seminar series organized by the Center for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology (CGEB), Bosso Campus.

"People that organize seminars like these should be applauded as academic activities are gradually dwindling in Nigerian Universities." He implored them to make the seminar regular in order to ensure that knowledge keeps comina in.

Prof. Akanji noted that the Center for Genetic Engineering is the arrow head of research in FUT, Minna and urged the researchers to publish their results in reputable journals so as to increase the University's visibility on the global map.

Director CGEB, Dr. Abdulkareem Saka spoke extensively on the need for regular seminars. He said a lot of health related discoveries are made every day and there is a need for these discoveries to be presented to colleagues and stakeholders.

Dr. Saka appreciated the students of the Center who have shown interest in moving the Center forward and also gave credit to the University Management, colleagues and the World Bank STEP-B project for their support.

Giving an overview of the seminar, Professor Emmanuel Ogbadoyi said that Africans are overburdened with the problems of infectious diseases and there is an increasing incidence of diseases such as cancer and diabetes with no sustainable control programme in place due to varying socio economic factors.

He noted that the available synthetic drugs in the market are not easily accessible, very expensive and there is also an increasing resistance to these drugs by the human body which eventually have after effects on the user.

Prof Ogbadoyi made known that their goal is to begin to look at herbal remedies that will help in fighting these diseases with little or no side effect on the human body and also obtain plant extracts with significant efficacy which will be standardized as herbal remedies in therapeutic control of target diseases.

He highlighted an achievement which is being made on potential treatment for Tripple Negative Breast Cancer (TNBC), a type of cancer that is very stubborn and hard to treat, noting that work is ongoing with plant extracts and hopes to see it to the final stage.

According to him, there is an availability of largely unexplored plants extracts and also an availability of skilled personnel for health research and if given the right tools, the drugs for these target diseases will be delivered to humanity.

HOLDS 2-DAY SEET REFRESHER WORKSHOP

he School of Engineering and Engineering Technology (SEET) has held a 2-day refresher workshop on Academic and Technical writing.

The workshop which was aimed at improving the skills of staff in thesis and journal articles writing was held on Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th November, 2016 at SEET.

Prof. Musa Aibinu and Dr. M. Saidu from SEET facilitated the workshop and put the participants through the rudiment of writing a good quality thesis and journal article to get them published in high ranking journals.

The participants came up with a communiqué at the end of the workshop that highlighted the need for various departments and units to set up research group with clearly defined goals.

The University was also urged to encourage researchers to publish in high impact journals and sponsor workshops where editors of selected high impact journals can sensitize researchers of the requirement for publication in their journals.
