# FRSC TRAINS FUTMINNA TOP SHOTS ON DRIVING PRINCIPLES

he Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) held a two day training for the Principal Officers, Deans and Directors of the Federal University of Technology, Minna on Monday 21st and Tuesday 22nd November, 2016.

The training which held at the Senate Chamber, Main Campus was titled "Driver Training." It was an interactive session which saw the FRSC talking on the very basics of driving.

In his speech, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Musbau Adewunmi Akanji, *FNSBMB, FAS,* expressed delight that the training, which had been in the pipeline for a very long time, finally came to see the light of the day. He explained that experience in driving does not prevent accidents from happening.

Prof. Akanji encouraged all the participants to go through with the training till the end in order to enjoy the full benefits so as to remember the basics of driving which some of them might have forgotten. He expressed hope of fixing another training session for other members of the University.

The Sector Commander of FRSC, Niger State Command, Susan Ada Ajenge, during her opening speech commended the Vice-Chancellor for his humanitarian efforts to the Commission and thanked him for the opportunity given to them to train the top echelon staff of the institution.

Susan Ajenge assured that at the end of the training, participants will begin to respect the rules and regulations of the FRSC while the laws of the Commission

will be adhered to strictly.

One of the resource persons on day one of the training, RC. Emmanuel Micheal focused on the causes, effects and precaution of road traffic crashes, traffic laws and regulations. He said everyday about 3,000 people are killed in crashes on unsafe roads worldwide, while noting that most of these crashes are predictable, preventable and are caused by three major factors which are the driver, the vehicle and the road.

Prevention of road crashes, he further explained, lies in the hands of the drivers, vehicle manufacturers and the government. The driver should obey traffic rules and regulations and should always adopt the defensive driving, which is driving to stay alive by assuming that other road users are not as sane as you; the vehicle manufacturers should ensure that all motor vehicles meet safety standards while the government must ensure quality control on the type of fairly used vehicles being imported into the country as well as ban the entry of sub standard, he suggested.

He implored the government to rise up to the challenge of providing better and motorable roads across the country so as to reduce crashes occasioned by bad roads.

Second day, ACC. Emmanuel Oluwadare dwelled extensively on vehicle maintenance, road traffic signs and driver management. The participants were admonished to have regular maintenance and to have daily check on their vehicles, to always adhere to road traffic signs, which are a group of simple signs and symbols erected by the side of the road coded in different colors and shapes.

Mal. Mohammed Wuna, the Director, Works and Maintenance Department, while giving the vote of thanks, was appreciative of the University Management for sponsoring the training and thanked FRSC Officials for imparting a lot during the course of the training, just as he urged the participants to make very good use of all that was learnt during the training.

At the end of the training session, the Vice-Chancellor was honoured with the title of a Special Regular Marshall, another arm of the FRSC, functions of which include monitoring of road users, Road Marshall Patrols and arresting of road user offenders amongst others. Certificates of Attendance were presented to all the participants.

# **NSC HOLDS SEMINAR ON "CLOUD COMPUTING"**

he Nigerian Computer Society (NSC), Niger State Chapter, yesterday held a seminar at the SNEPCO Computer Laboratory, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Main Campus on Cloud Computing with the theme "Cloud Computing: Socio Economic Implications and Security Challenges."

Speaking at the event, the Vice-Chancellor of the

University, Prof. Musbau Adewunmi Akanji, **FNSBMB**, **FAS**, who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Admin), Prof. Suleiman Sadiku said it was a pleasure to have the society domiciled in the University, which is also the first university to establish a School of Information and Communication Technology (SICT).

Prof. Akanji said that the University has come a long way in becoming ICT compliant, noting that the struggles have finally paid off with the institution's many achievements in ICT, one of which is that the winner of the 2016 IT competition for tertiary institutions came from the University.

He said nobody has a reason not to be computer literate as everything and every sector has keyed into the computer world, he urged the participants to pay keen attention to the speakers to learn new and great ideas.

The NSC, Niger State Chapter's Chairman, Mal. Zubair Emimaru said that the Nigeria Computer Society is the umbrella organization of all Information Technology professionals, interest groups and stakeholders in Nigeria, whose objectives is to promote IT education and trama, research, policy formulation global affiliation while urging professionals in this field to join the network by registering with the NCS.

The Chairman said the objective of the seminar is to sensitize the stakeholders about the impending need to join the cloud as a result of its tremendous economic benefits, noting that virtualization within networks has given rise to the evolution of cloud computing as it enables a dynamic data centre to provide a pool of resources that can be exploited as needed by clients to meet their workloads and varying business demands.

He urged the participants to explore opportunities through this forum, to think and come up with what they can do in the cloud and also ways which it can affect the economy of Nigeria.
