According to the Director of the Centre, Prof. Asimiyu Jinadu, the MoU seeks to promote collaborative research, student exchange, support with expert knowledge in teaching and capacity building amongst others.

The initial five years MoU expired in May, 2016 and renewed for another five years with effect from May 2016.

In a related development, a collaboration has been established between FUT, CDRM&DS Minna and Bournemouth University Disaster Management Centre (BUDMC).

Under this new partnership, the CDRM&DS is to become a project partner Bournemouth University, United Kingdom in a research proposal titled 'AFRIGATE' submitted for funding by the UK's National Environment Research Council (NERC).

The Vice-Chancellor and the Project Director, Prof. Lee Miles sealed the deal during a working launch meeting at the just concluded International Disaster Risk Conference (IDRC) held in Davos, Switzerland between Saturday, August 27 and Thursday, September 1, 2016.

FIND ALTERNATIVE POWER SOURCES, VC **URGES ENGINEERS**

he Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS, has urged engineers to find alternative sources of generating power for the country.

Prof. Akanji stated this today at the 1st Annual General Meeting and Conference of the Nigerian Institution of Engineers (NIMechE), a division of the Nigerian Society of Engineers (NSE), which took place at the Chemical Engineering Lecture Hall with the theme "Mechanical Engineering and Renewable Energy: Solution to the Global Energy Crisis."

He said he was proud that the event was holding at the University, saying that the theme is a very critical one and a topic of global concern, considering the power challenges the country is facing right now.

Prof. Akanji further implored the conference to look for other sources of power to support the hydroelectric power currently used in the country while thanking the NSE for the merit award given to him.

The National Chairman of the Nigerian Institution of Mechanical Engineers, Engr. Ugochukwu Nzurumike who is an alumnus of FUT, Minna said NIMechE started in the University and that he was proud of how big the Society has grown.

Engr. Nzurumike said that Nigeria is a blessed country with great human resources, while imploring the Shiroro Power Station to keep supplying more power to the country.

The guest speaker and Chief Operating Officer, North-South Power, Shiroro Hydroelectric Power Station, Engr. Daudu Abdulaziz who was represented by Engr. Isaac Akanbi, the Assistant General Manager in charge of hydrology spoke on "The Challenges of Maintaining a Hydro Power Plant: The Shiroro Experience."

He spoke extensively on the challenges the Shiroro Hydroelectric Power Station has gone through and also the nitty-gritty of the maintenance culture imbibed by the power station, how they have been able to maintain its installed capacity of 600 mega watts of power, which is one of his most significant achievements since taking over the power station in 2013.

MANAGEMENT HONOURS ITE STUDENTS
