The Vice-Chancellor gave this advice during the SIWES Orientation for 400 level students from the School of Engineering and Engineering Technology, School of Entrepreneurship and Management Technology and School of Information and Communication Technology held on Wednesday, April 5, 2017 at the University Auditorium, Main Campus.

Prof. Akanji, represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Suleiman Sadiku stated that FUT, Minna is the best University of Technology in the country and urged the students to go out to the industries with pride, dignity and protect the good name of the institution.

The VC urged the students to be security conscious and further advised them to use the opportunity to start working on their final year projects.

In his remarks at the event, the Area Manager Industrial Training Fund, Mrs. Ifeoma Ihezua, represented by the Head of Training, Mal. Saleh called on the students to ask questions at their places of industrial attachment, adding that the IT scheme is designed to engage students through direct contact with the industries to gain practical experience.

Mrs. Ihezua disclosed that ITF had trained large number of students since inception of the scheme in 1973 while noting that the federal government has invested massively in the scheme and urged the students to take the exercise serious.

In his vote of thanks, Dr. Lekan Sani from the School of Environmental Technology commended the University Management for their continuous support for the programme and praised SIWES for organizing the event.

The students were tutored on the rudiments of SIWES programme, documentation, allowances, code of conduct at the place of industrial attachment and safety by different instructors at the event. MENINGITIS IN NIGERIA: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

eningitis is an inflammation (swelling) of the protective membranes covering the brain and spinal cord known as the meninges. This inflammation is usually caused by an infection of the fluid surrounding the brain and spinal cord.

Meningitis is usually caused by bacteria or viruses. Symptoms can come on very quickly or gradually over a few days. It can kill within 24 hours so be very observant.

Symptoms of Meningitis

- Severe persistent headache
- Neck stiffness and pain that makes it difficult to touch your chin to your chest
- Sensitivity to bright light
- Seizures
- Sleepiness and sluggishness
- Nausea and vomiting
- Decreased appetite
- Confusion and disorientation (acting goofy)
- Skin rash
- Irritability

How is Meningitis Spread?

- Spread through close personal contact such as coughing, sneezing and kissing
- Contact with throat secretions from an infected person (for example, phlegm or saliva).
- Sharing personal belongings
- Poor personal hygiene

Prevention Tips

- Avoid contact with sick people and their body secretions
- Get vaccinated if available
- Get adequate rest
- Avoid smoking
- If you have been in contact with a sick person in an affected area, visit your doctor to give you preventive antibiotics to reduce chances of contacting the disease.

Vaccines which can help protect against Meningitis are:

- Haemophilus Influenzae type B (Hib) vaccine
- Pheumococcal conjugate vaccine
- Meningococcal vaccine

Who is at Risk?

- People with low immunity e.g. People with HIV/AIDS, Autoimmune Disorders, Chemotherapy etc.
- People sleeping in crowded spaces
- Pregnant women
- Children under the age of 5 years old and the elderly

Complications from Meningitis Infection

If not properly managed, it can lead to:

- Hearing loss
- Visual loss
- Seizures
- Permanent brain damage
- Death
