FUTMINNA COUNCIL MEETS STAFF, STUDENTS

- Pro-Chancellor Assures of Fairness, Justice
- **Urges Students to Shun Sentiments**

he Pro-Chancellor and Chairman, Governing Council, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Femi Odekunle has assured that the Council under his leadership has listening ears and would uphold justice in the discharge of its duties.

Prof. Odekunle who gave this assurance on Monday, June 12, 2017 during a meeting between members of the inaugurated Council the newly and University Congregation at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus said that the Council would always be guided by the existing law, principles of fairness, justice and common sense.

He however, appealed to staff to remain committed to the University's mandate and as well continue to cooperate with the Council and Management of the institution.

The Pro-Chancellor who stressed the need for mutual respect and cooperation among all cadres of the University staff in order to achieve the vision and mission of the institution, said everybody in the system is important.

On Staff-Student relationship, he urged lecturers to help students imbibe integrity and anti-corruption attitude.

He however, warned that Council would deal "squarely" and "ruthlessly" with any case of corruption brought before it.

Prof. Odekunle described FUT, Minna as a peaceful, secure and performing university.

Earlier, in an interactive session with students at the same venue, the Pro-Chancellor enjoined the students to shun primordial, ethnic and religious sentiments when dealing with others in order to make their lives better.

He disclosed that Council decided to meet with them first because they were the most crucial stakeholders in the University and leaders of tomorrow on whom the country would depend for technological advancement.

Prof. Odekunle emphasised the importance of good character and admonished them on the need for critical thinking and objectivity in all they do.

The Pro-Chancellor told the students that FUT, Minna has one of the best environments among Nigerian universities, which they should be proud of.

There was a question and answer session where the Pro-Chancellor and the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji responded to questions from the students.

On his part, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Akanji, urged the students to always report service failure and challenges they face to the authorities, just as he assured them of improvement in all the identified areas.

Pro-Chancellor Addresses Senate

On Tuesday, June 13, 2017, members of Council had an interactive session with the University Senate.

Addressing the Senate at the Senate Chamber, Main Campus, the Pro-Chancellor, Prof. Odekunle said the Senate is the soul of the University based on its representation in Council, Congregation as well as other committees of the University and urged them to put the interest of the institution first in all their deliberations.

The Pro-Chancellor informed the University Senate that Council under his leadership would not interfere with the statutory responsibilities of the Senate, adding that the Council would be guided by the extant laws of the institution. He admonished them to be objective in their decision making.

"As Senate members of the University, your decision should be objective and do not allow parochial sentiments to override your sense of judgment. You must ensure that good conscience and fairness determine the outcome of your decisions," the Pro-Chancellor advised.

Council On Facility Tour

In order to get a first-hand impression of facilities at the University, members of the newly inaugurated Governing Council, led by the Pro-Chancellor, Prof. Femi Odekunle had on Monday, June 12, 2017 embarked on a familiarisation tour of the Bosso and Main Campuses of the institution.

They were also at the School of Information and Communication Technology, (SICT), where the Acting Dean, Engr. Prof. Elizabeth Onwuka showed them some facilities.

AGAIN, NUC ACCREDITATION TEAMS VISIT FUTMINNA

n pursuit of academic excellence in the country and to ensure that programmes run in Nigerian universities are in tandem with the National Universities Commission (NUC) benchmarks, different teams assembled by the regulatory body have visited the Federal University of Technology, Minna on accreditation exercises.

The programmes that underwent the accreditation scrutiny were; Chemistry, Mathematics, Biochemistry and Science Education departments (Chemistry education, Biology education and Mathematics education). The teams presented their preliminary reports at different venues within the Bosso and Main Campuses of the institution.

Presenting the report for the department of Chemistry held at the School of Science and Technology Education Boardroom, the leader of the team, Prof. Percy Onianwa, from the University of Ibadan, maintained that the department's curriculum was in line with NUC standards and commended staff for scaling up research in the department.

Prof. Onianwa applauded the department for having large numbers of professors and Ph.D. holders and urged those who are yet to enroll for their Ph.D. to do so without further delay.

While presenting the report for Mathematics department, the team leader, Prof. Donatus Igbokwe from University of Uyo, expressed satisfaction with the department's curriculum, philosophy, admission requirements and quality of its staff.

Early this week, it was the turn of the accreditation team who visited three programmes in the of Science Education, namely; Chemistry education, education and Mathematics education, School of Science and Technology Education (SSTE).

During their exit visit to the University Management, the leader of the team, Prof. (Mrs.) Uche Agwagah, from University of Nigeria, Nsukka thanked the Vice-Chancellor for the warm reception accorded the team during the period of the exercise, adding that the effective leadership exhibited by the Management has accounted for the effective performance by lecturers in the department.

The Professor of Science Education praised department in terms of excellent learning environment, hardworking lecturers, and standard electronic library to boost teaching and learning. Others were; competent academic staff and comprehensive students' handbook with zero tolerance for examination malpractice.

Presenting the report for Biochemistry department, the leader of the NUC team, Prof. Godwin Ichekanu Adoga from University of Jos, said the team was impressed with the department's admission requirements, curriculum, students' handbook and physical facilities, saying that the department has all what it takes to produce quality graduates.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FAS, FNSBMB, said the notable achievement of the present Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission (NUC), Prof. Abubakar Rasheed is the re-organisation of the accreditation procedures by using professionals to assess their own fields.

"I think what the Executive Secretary is doing is very commendable and is bearing fruits; that is why it is easy for the accreditation teams to come to conclusion after thorough assessment of the programmes," he disclosed.
