PROF JUNAID CALLS FOR URBAN SLUM DEVELOPMENT

igeria as a nation has instituted several housing policies and the level of achievement is not commensurate with the efforts put, hence the provision of decent and affordable housing for the majority of urban poor has continued to remain a mirage.

Prof. Asimiyu Mohammed Junaid made this assertion when he delivered the 51st Inaugural Lecture of the University, titled: *Housing for The Nigerian Urban*

Poor: A Reality or A Mirage? on Thursday, May 18, 2017 at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus.

The erudite scholar, who is the Dean, School of Environmental Technology (SET), described the urban poor as low income earners or households who cannot afford the basic needs to live a healthy and minimal comfortable life. According to him, lack of good housing is associated with insecurity, poor health and wellbeing, poverty and all forms of deprivation.

Prof. Junaid explained that constructing a house is a capital intensive venture, as such, for a low income earner to own a house, there must be a solid financial support either from the government or private sector. Since majority of the low income earners are underemployed or unemployed, who do not have access to mortgage finance. Therefore, the desire to own a house remain a lifelong ambition for the urban poor.

The problem of housing affordability he said, is compounded, by the increase in house rent, housing demand and supply, inflation, economic recession and fall in foreign exchange rates. maintained that the urban poor have no place to stay rather than the slum where they live in constant fear of eviction and demolition. Such exercise, he pointed out, bring about a lot of agonies, grief, frustration as well as feelings of rejection and abandonment of the citizens by the authorities.

"A typical demolition scenario is characterized by protest, hues and cries, hopelessness and helplessness. The aftermath normally leaves behind rubbles of ruined houses of the urban poor, large population of homeless citizen and above all, psychological trauma," he enumerated.

The former Director of CDRM&DS, while recommending the review and completion of the existing housing projects across the country said that the slum provides housing for the huge urban human resources with diverse skills and human ingenuity, adding that this population drives the economy of the cities by providing big market and labour force.

The Dean called for provision of infrastructure in order to make the living condition of the slum better.

He stressed the need for government to ensure the housing scheme reached the targeted poor rather than being hijacked by the rich while ensuring the regularization of the existing informal land titles in Nigeria.

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji **FNSBMB**, **FAS**, in his remark indicated the importance of inaugural lecture in the life a professor as it is presented once. He reiterated the need for other professors that are yet to deliver theirs to do so.

Prof. Akanji while thanking everybody for attending the lecture wished them journey mercies back to their respective destinations.

n view of the need to boost inter-university research collaborations aimed at addressing societal problems, one of the research groups of the Federal University of Technology, Minna known as the Advanced Engineering Innovation Research Group (AEIRG) has concluded a 3-day research tour to the Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, Osun State.

The research group was led by the Director, Centre for Open Distance and e-Learning (CODeL) and Head, Department of Mechatronics Engineering, Prof. Abiodun Musa Aibinu.

The team's first point of call was at the Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering where they were received by the Head of the department, Dr. Thomas Yesufu before they were handed over to the Head of the Communication Research Group domiciled in the department, Dr. Solomon Adeniran.

Speaking during the interactive session, Dr. Adeniran said it would be a dream come true for both parties to consummate their research collaborations with the aim of working together for the good of the society, adding that quality research is needed to achieve the much needed development in the country.

He expressed satisfaction with the quality of research works exhibited by the University's team while stating that OAU research group is desirous to collaborate with FUT, Minna because of its antecedents in conducting world class research which has resulted in the group winning many local and international laurels.

Dr. Adeniran who was the leader of the team that launched Nigeria SAT-1 further disclosed that the group has collaboration deals with several notable organizations in the world and expressed optimism that adding FUT, Minna to the list would enhance the fortune of the group. Prof. Aibinu said the purpose of the visit was to finalize areas of collaboration with the group based on the outcome of their earlier visit, noting that the group's mission is to collaborate with renowned research groups in the country that have the capacity to address the research needs of the country.

The University research group later had another interactive session with staff of Africa Centre of Excellence in Software Engineering at the Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife.

The group was received by the ACE Project Head, Prof. Aderounmu, who stated that working with the group would be in line with the objectives of the Centre in developing the next generation of scientists, researchers and teachers by stimulating their creativity and excellence in research and innovation.

The ACE Project Head, further disclosed that the Centre is desirous to provide the launch pad for start-up companies borne out of university research activities, and collaboration with partnering ICT companies, who would have the competitive advantage of proximity and direct access to the intellectual infrastructure and output of the university.

He disclosed that he was marvelled by the quantum of research prototypes and designs executed by the group and expressed desire to partner with the group.

Responding, Prof. Aibinu stated that FUT, Minna is a powerhouse in ICT training among Nigerian universities and revealed that the group is ready and well equipped to collaborate with ACE.

He assured them that the partnership would be a win-win situation for both parties.

The next trip for the group will be a week research tour to some federal government ministries, departments, agencies and other notable organisations in Abuja.

Out of the total of 13 applicants from the University in the 2016/2017 Academic Session, Oluyomi Ayanfeoluwa, 400 level, Department of Cyber Security Science with a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 4.87 emerged first; Adebayo Kabiru, 500 level, Civil Engineering, with 4.81 CGPA came second while Bello Mubarak Ayo, 400 level, 4.82 CGPA, Chemical Engineering got the 3rd position.

Each of the winner got a cash prize of N60 thousand naira.

In his brief remark at the award ceremony which took place at the Vice-Chancellor's conference room, Main Campus, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, *FNSBMB, FAS*, said that it is always a thing of joy to see organisations like EON coming to the aid of students as poverty was doing a lot of harm to educational progress of many indigent students.

While commending the Student Affairs Division for successfully coordinating the scholarship exercise, he implored the beneficiaries to make judicious use of the money.

FUT STAFF COOPERATIVE POSTS N18.2M PROFIT, DECLARES 50K DIVIDEND ...SHAREHOLDERS ELECT ASHAFA AS PRESIDENT

he Federal University of Technology, Minna Staff Cooperative Multi-Purpose Society Limited has declared a profit after tax of N18, 260, 134. 35 million for the financial year ended December 31, 2016 and declared fifty kobo per share dividend for members.

This disclosure was made by the Treasurer, Mallam Yandalu Yusuf at the Society's 22nd Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on Wednesday, May 17, 2017 at the CPES Hall, Bosso Campus.

Mallam Yandalu stated that the Cooperative Society recorded unprecedented success during the financial year under review, adding that the success was achieved based on members support, understanding and cooperation.

He disclosed that the Cooperative goodwill resulted in 1,426 membership strength at the end of the financial year with a total share capital of N27,771,580.00, adding that the backbone of the Cooperative Society is in the area of thrift savings which amounted to N601,789,512.00 as at December, 2016.

On the need to boost the Cooperative thrift savings, the Treasurer made an appeal to shareholders for minimum monthly contribution to be pegged at N5,000 and urged members to desist from withdrawing their thrift savings so that the Cooperative Society can serve them better.

Earlier, the President, Alh. Mohammed Sani Abubakar Kuta said the Annual General Meeting is an exciting day when members come together to discuss issues that would lead to the progress of the Society.

The President commended members for the mandate given to the Executive to spearhead the affairs of the Society in the last four years.

He disclosed that the following as some of the achievements of the present executive members:

continuous improvement in disbursement of all forms of loan packages to members, purchase of 14.4 hectares of land at Dama village for allocation to interested members on loan and donation of computer sets and accessories to FUT Staff School and Model Secondary School as part of its corporate social responsibility.

At the AGM, a motion was moved for the dissolution of the Executive Council which was unanimously seconded by shareholders. That paved the way for the election of new executive members to pilot the affairs of the Society in the next two years.

The election and counting of ballot papers lasted up to 10 pm in the night by the Electoral Committee members, the Chairman and Dean, School of Science and Technology Education, Prof. Ben Atsumbe announced the following as the newly elected executive members of the Cooperative Society: President, Mallam Ashafa Mohammed Aminu who polled 457 votes to defeat Alh. Ahmed Dauda who got 381 votes; Vice-President, Mrs. Damaris Tsado; Secretary, Mr. Adamu Mohammed E. Others are: Treasurer, Ahmed Ishaku Kuta; Business Secretary, Mr. Simon Gana while the out gone President, Secretary and Treasurer will serve as ex-officio members.

In his acceptance speech, the President, Mallam Ashafa who is also the Deputy Director, Internal Audit Unit, said the emergence of the new executive marks the beginning of a new dawn in the annals of the Cooperative Society, stating that pragmatic efforts are needed to rebuild the Society to greatness.

He urged members to forget about their political differences and join hands with the present administration to move the Society forward, while assuring members that the era of parochial sentiments and favouritism are over and promised to ensure equal rights for all members at all times.

"Our bane is the paradox of putting sentiment and emotion before due process," he noted.

He admonished members to change their attitude towards the Cooperative and solicited for the support of all members.

"We must know that our Cooperative will not change except we change our attitude. The notion of this is how it has always been done should be discarded," he advised.

The newly elected executive members were later sworn – in by the Chairman of the Electoral Committee immediately after the election results were announced.

RANSOMWARE ATTACKS: AWARENESS AND SECURITY TIPS - Dr. Joseph A. Ojeniyi, Department of Cyber Security Science, SICT

efinition: As the name implies, it is malicious software that stops you from using your computer or computer network or files until a ransom is paid or a specified operation is performed. It is a form of denial of service attack with a promise of service restoration on payment of a ransom.

Evolution: Ransomware attack launched against Windows operating system started in 1989. Since then, it has metamorphosed into different forms and complexities. PC Cyborg Ransomware attack was first seen in December 1989. It combined a symmetric key and initialization vector to encrypt the files in the computer drives. Thereafter, different forms of Ransomware emerged. Some of them were Fake Antivirus (AV) Ransomware, Master Boot Record (MBR) Ransomware, Fake FBI Ransomware and SMS Ransomware.

Fake AV Ransomware first evolved in 2004. It provided fake antivirus solution, system performance optimization and registry care. It offered paid solutions to the problems of your system that never existed in the first place. It became significant in 2005.

MBR Ransomware first emerged in 2010. It substitutes the system original master boot record with its own code and denies legitimate services from legitimate users. In most cases, it never encrypts files but only prompts the ransom message at system boot-up time. It was significantly manifested in 2011 with Trojan and Bootlock Ransomware.

Fake FBI Ransomware was first noticed in 2011. It requests for the fine payment masqueraded to be initiated from official local law enforcement agencies. Several other versions were released later.

SMS Ransomware is the one associated with Android platforms. The first in this form was noticed in 2012. Since then, it has evolved in different dimensions infecting android-based devices.

Categories: There are two major categories of Ransomware: (i) Locker Ransomware and (ii) Crypto Ransomware

- i. Locker Ransomware is a computer locker that prevents access to a computer system
- ii. Crypto Ransomware is a data locker denies access to data, files or services in a computer system or a computer network.

Target: The main target or goal of both types of Ransomware is to deny access to a legitimate object until a ransom is paid.

WannaCry Ransomware: It is an ongoing global Crypto Ransomware cyberattack against Microsoft Windows Operating Systems. It encrypts data or files with a promise of decryption after a ransom is paid. The attack was noticed to have commenced on Friday 12th May, 2017. It has affected over 150 countries. More so, all countries having huge deployment of Microsoft Windows Operating Systems have been tagged as susceptible nations including Nigeria.

Preventive and Corrective Measures:

The following tips will be helpful in preventing or safeguarding against Ransomware attacks:

- i. As much as possible avoid internet connection when not needed
- ii. Use genuine and latest operating systems
- iii. Carry out periodic update of your systems
- iv. Avoid use of free downloads especially when the sources are not guaranteed
- v. When downloading free software, try to read and understand the download agreements before proceeding.
- vi. Never download attachments with anonymous sources or unverified sources.
- vii. Regular security and vulnerability assessment of your system by cyber security expert is recommended
- viii. The list is not exhaustive, always consult a trusted cyber security experts around you.
- Man being the weakest link in a network setup, arm yourself with up-to-date Everyday Cyber Security Best Practice.

The following tips will be helpful corrective measures in the case of successful attack:

- i. Quickly isolate your system from a network environment or internet connection
- ii. Don't pay any ransom as no guarantee of service restoration. Payment of a ransom may further expose your system
- iii. Immediately, call the attention of Cyber Security Expert in your reach for technical solutions as corrective measures are case-specific.

Current Trend: With the recent discovery of the damaging effects of Ransomware and the global consciousness, it seems a lot has not been known about the menace of the malware. It is not what is used to be. It is constantly evolving with sophisticated approaches. Advanced hackers now present Ransomware as a service.
