FUTMINNA GETS ENDOWMENT FOR BEST GRADUATING STUDENT IN MATHS

The Federal University of Technology, Minna, yesterday received endowment of N500,000.00 from the family of the 59th Inaugural Lecturer, Prof. Hussaini Anthony Makun. The don announced the donation on behalf of his siblings while delivering the Inaugural Lecture titled: ***“Improving Public Health and International Trade Through Mycotoxin Control,”*** noted that the prize donation was in honour of their late father for the best graduating student in Mathematics.

Mycotoxins, the Professor of Biochemistry, stated at the

Caverton Lecture Theatre are contamination of grains with poisonous fungal secondary metabolites and when consumed can cause diseases in man and animals.

There are over three hundred mycotoxins found in foods, he pointed out, but only five have the most impact on agriculture, public health and economy. And they are: Aflatoxin (AFs), Trichothecenes, Fumonisin (FBs), Zearalenone (ZEA), Putulin (PAT) and Ochratoxin A (OTA). His contributions to the prevention and control of these menaces to mankind is in identifying and measuring the extent of exposure and risks associated to the presence of mycotoxins in Nigerian Food System and invariably driving intervention strategies against the food borne hazards. The Lecturer mentioned that his research identified in Nigerian foods and feeds, fungi that secrete toxins that are lethal to mice and the five mycotoxins mentioned above are major toxins secreted by these fungi in the following foods: Sorghum (guinea corn), rice, maize, wheat, beans, millet sesame, acha groundnuts etc.

According to him, the presence of these toxins at unacceptable levels particularly in simultaneous occurrence in our foods are not only associated to the increase severity and incidence of liver, kidney, malnutrition, infertility, HIV/AIDs, cancer and other

infectious diseases but have adverse impact on international trade. Consequently, he added, our nation's economy which necessitates their elimination from our food and trade systems.

The Lecturer who is the Chairman, Directorate for Research, Innovation and Development (DRID) gave a clue to the prevention and control of mycotoxins, where he established the reducing effects of local processing methods on mycotoxins levels. He also derived botanicals with fungicidal effects, while obtaining indigenous atoxigenic fungi that bioexcluded and suppress mycotoxins production by the toxigenic ones of the same species.

Prof. Makun further provided code of practice for the prevention and reduction of aflatoxin and ochratoxin A in sorghum based products.

In his recommendations, the scholar encouraged the teaching of mycotoxins in schools in order to train farmers on how to eliminate risks of mycotoxins contamination. He also called on the Standard Organisation of Nigeria (SON) to conduct national toxicological and risk analysis of mycotoxins and other contaminants in Nigerian dietary system. And that the data generated should be used to set national standards that fit our agricultural and cultural systems instead of adapting international standards.

Cereals department diets system according to the scholar, should be abolished, while advocating the diversification of our dietary system to include mycotoxins resistant crops like acha, millet, fresh root, tuber and vegetables.

“The fate of Nigeria lies in the hands of the academic and military institutions. While the soldiers keep it united, the academics are expected to innovate and convert it to a wealthy knowledge based nation,” Prof. Makun concluded.

In his remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, *FNSBMB, FAS*, thanked the lecturer for the endowment, stating that Senate would be informed about it and that the donation would be presented to the deserving student during the 2018 Convocation Ceremony.

Prof. Akanji further noted that such gestures to universities normally stays in perpetuity. He thanked every people for attending the lecture.

The lecture was well attended by both town and gown as well as the military.

The former Registrar, University of Ibadan pointed out that universities have come a long way and have been influenced by their antecedents universally in spite of local culture or flavour and that certain norms are universal which make universities distinct from other higher institutions.

The seasoned administrator, said culture defines behaviour, ethics and values and it drives the strategy of the institutions for delivering on its mission adding that there is a universal academic culture borne out of the antecedents which define universities world wide as centres of learning.

The administrative don bemoaned how university ceremonies in Nigeria have become a market place in which there is no order or decorum as a consequence of subsuming the academia under our culture of expediency. She stressed that the academia, have to uphold best practices, values and heritage.

Speaking further, Chief Mrs. Ladipo stated that matriculation and convocation ceremonies are the vehicles through which university share their mission and vision and showcase their excellence to the entire world, adding that it is also the period to celebrate their fundamental purpose which is to provide students with transformative educational experience and instil in them a passion for learning.

She further called on all stakeholders to take up their responsibilities to perform university ceremonies in a very dignified manners that shows decorum, discipline and portrays the best tradition of university.

"The administrators duty is to uphold the dignity of thought and learning and maintain exact standard in academic ceremonies," Chief Mrs. Ladipo echoed.

In his remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, *FNSBMB, FAS*, thanked the lecturer for her rich presentation. He disclosed that FUT, Minna is doing excellently, well in ranking but we need to maintain this position by constantly aspiring to improve on its performance and put in more energy and innovation to stay on top, which is why an expert has been called on to address the university culture.

"We would imbibe all the points highlighted by the lecturer on university culture, improve on the ones we already do and start on the ones we don't do to achieve best practices," Prof. Akanji stated.

PROF OKEKE MAKES CASE FOR PHYSICISTS, ENGINEERS TO CARRY OUT GOVT. PROJECTS

Disturbed by the high rate of unemployment in the country, a veteran professor of physics and astronomy, Prof. Emeritus Pius N. Okeke has called on government at different levels to utilize physics and engineering graduates to handle all government road constructions, power and mineral explorations.

The doyen of Physics gave this advice when he delivered the keynote lecture titled: *Harnessing Physics and*

Technology for National Development during the 40th Annual Conference of the Nigerian Institute of Physics (NIP) held at the Centre for Preliminary and Extra-Mural (CPES) Hall on Tuesday, November 21, 2017.

Prof. Okeke said government had no business awarding such contracts to foreigners because Nigerian graduates have the capacity to deliver such jobs with little supervision, adding that physicists and engineers should be trained and given opportunity to try their hands and learn in the process.

To bridge the gap between the academia and the industries, the don advised that the National Universities Commission (NUC) should review Nigerian Universities curriculum to make industrial attachment programme possible while also noting that institutions should change their mode of lecture delivering to make it more practical oriented so that private sectors would find their products useful.

The scholar maintained that for Nigeria to achieve national development, there is need to support ground-breaking applied research in physics and technology with incentives for researchers and provision of all necessary facilities and equipment. He, advised that such support should extended across all tertiary institutions, colleges of technologies and research institutions.

Delivering his address at the event, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, *FNSBMB, FAS* expressed the University's appreciation to the Council members of NIP for finding FUT, Minna worthy to host the conference, saying that the conference theme was apt in view of the need to address the various economy challenges facing the country through physics and technology.

The Vice-Chancellor who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) of the institution, Prof. Oluwole Olakanmi Morenikeji said the University is excited to host the conference this year and would be willing to host the 41st edition of the conference next year again.

Prof. Akanji commended NIP for honouring him at the conference while informing them that the Department of Physics is very dear to the University.

In his address, the National President, NIP, Prof. David Malgwi welcome participants to the conference and hailed FUT, Minna for organizing the best ever conference in the history of NIP in recent times.

"This is a confirmation that with determination, a group of committed people working together can indeed make a difference despite all odds and obvious daunting challenges", he disclosed.

He stated that without good knowledge of physics, the country cannot have engineers, technologists, doctors, pharmacists etc.

The Head, Department of Physics, FUT, Minna, Prof. Uno Uno said the theme of the conference and its location are apt, stating that the lead papers and the technical papers would attempt to provide solutions to the plethora of societal problems.

The event also witnessed the presentation of awards to three distinguished personalities namely; Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, the Rector, Federal Polytechnic, Bida, Dr. Abubakar Dzukogi and Hon. Dr. Danladi Umar Abdulhameed.
