PHARMACEUTICAL DEVT: PROF DAUDA CALLS FOR SYNERGY

Prof. Bukar Dauda of the Department of Chemistry, School of Physical Sciences (SPS), made this assertion yesterday when he delivered the 54th Inaugural Lecture of the Federal University of Technology, Minna at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus.

Prospects for Transforming Traditional Medicines into Modern Pharmaceuticals," Prof. Dauda said that, if pursued in sustainable manner, the move would be a large-scale foreign exchange earner.

He maintained that in view of the country's diverse and untapped flora, it could rival China and India that have pursued deliberate policy research

transformation of their traditional medicines into modern pharmaceuticals.

Prof. Dauda, however, bemoaned the vacuum in the regulation, assessment of safety, efficacy and quality control of the use of herbal medicines in West Africa, adding that research into the properties of medicinal plants has not received adequate attention, leaving traditional medical practices in their undeveloped forms.

> To adequately address the problem, he called for the screening and development of the country's natural products which will in turn enhance national healthcare programmes and usher the large country into scale production of pharmaceuticals.

> He disclosed that Natural Product Chemistry has contributed immensely to the structural elucidation of many compounds used in traditional medicines, a situation that has aided the scientific study of nature and potentials of the herbs.

> The Don expressed hope that with improved quality and modernisation, the traditional medical system will be integrated into the mainstream of Nigeria's medical system.

He called for a reappraisal of herbal remedies for their potential contribution to the economy and health care programme.

In his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FAS, FNSBMB, commended the Inaugural Lecturer for his contributions to knowledge.

He also thanked all dignitaries for attending the event.

The Vice-Chancellor made this disclosure during the 2017 FUT, Minna Alumni Reunion dinner held on Saturday, September 30, 2017 at the Justice Idris Legbo Kutigi International Conference Centre, Minna, Niger State.

Prof. Akanji stated that the University is happy with the numerous commendations received from employers and government agencies on the performance of its alumni adding that the institution is very proud of their achievements in life.

The VC stated that alumni are the real owners of the University and urged them to show more interest in the activities of the institution. He also disclosed that the University is doing well among comity of universities in Nigeria based on the latest webo-metric and 4ICU rankings.

"I am pleased to inform you that FUT, Minna is now number 5 in 4ICU ranking and 45 in Africa out of over 4, 323 universities that were ranked by international organizations. We are also first in Nigeria among the specialised universities," Prof. Akanji stated.

He informed the alumni that the University has reengineered its transcript delivery process from three months to one week and that graduates of the University now get their certificates on the day of convocation. He further advised the alumni to remember their alma mater by giving back to the University.

Speaking earlier, the Chairman, National Caretaker Committee of FUT, Minna Alumni, Dr. Mohammed Jiya expressed appreciation to all members of the University alumni for the sacrifices made for the event to take place despite the short notice, adding that the event has boosted the awareness level of the existence of FUT, Minna alumni.

The Chairman noted that the maiden edition of the Alumni Reunion programme was geared at reconnecting with the institution's graduates with the hope of building a robust alumni association that every graduate of the University would be proud of. He called for strong working relationship between the University Management and the Alumni.

Dr. Jiya disclosed that the body is committed to the development of the University while stating that the University would start feeling the impact of its alumni in no distant time. He commended the Local Organizing Committee for organising the event.

e must all take advantage of the paramount role education plays in achieving national growth and development which is the needed tool for sustainable development in any nation."

The Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS stated this on Wednesday, October 4, 2017 during the opening ceremony of the 5th Annual International Conference of School of Science and Technology Education (SSTE), titled: "Enhancing Science And Technology Education In A Dwindling Economy." The event took place at the CPES Hall, Bosso Campus

of the University.

The Vice-Chancellor who said that the conference theme is very apt, urged the government to design specific policies on Science and Technology Education and ensure its implementation and sustainability to promote science and technology in view of the present economic situation of our country. He further encouraged more Nigerians to study science and technology.

Speaking at the event, the Dean SSTE, Prof. Bernard Atsumbe, highlighted science and technology as the key to Nigeria's transformation, adding that Nigeria is ranked among the 20 strongest economies in the world and has the largest Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in Africa. "These achievements may be short lived if the country doesn't urgently invest substantial resources into science and technology and key sectors of the economy," he said.

Prof. Atsumbe who wished the participants a successful deliberations expressed optimistism that the conference would provide relevant answers that will enhance science and technology in a dwindling economy like ours. He thanked the Vice-Chancellor and his Management team for their endless support.

The keynote speaker, Prof. Kriek Jeanne, a professor of science education from Institute of Science and Technology Education, University of South Africa (UNISA), Pretoria pointed out the need for teachers to follow the trends of technology in their methodology of teaching. According to her, researches have shown that students who use computer moderately perform better than those who rarely do. She charged the scientists and technologists to have "driven question" that is "what can I do for my community?"

The Deputy Dean, School of Science and Technology Education and Chairman, Local Organizing Committee, Dr. Gambari Isiaka, thanked the University Management and other guests for finding time to grace the occasion.
