NIPOST PAYS BUSINESS VISIT TO VC

he Nigeria Postal Services (NIPOST) has pledged to effectively serve the University if appointed as its national courier to handle the distribution of Course Materials under the e-learning platform.

The District Postal Manager, NIPOST, Minna District, Mrs. J. H. Shallangwa made this known during a business visit to the University today at the VC's Conference Room, Main Campus when she proposed to the University to also appoint NIPOST as the sole carrier of students transcripts.

The District Postal Manager also called for the revision of EMS Credit Scheme and reintroduction of the implementation of the stamp duty law. The law, she said, stipulates the fixing of a 50 naira postage stamp to all transactions of cash value of one thousand naira and above.

She applauded the University for being the first government agency to commence the implementation of the directive of the Accountant General on the stamp duty law for all government institutions and appealed for continuous patronage as NIPOST has in place new policies to ensure better services.

Speaking further, NIPOST Corporate Communication Manager, Mr. Musa Nda pointed out that the postal organisation has changed the way it does business due to the dynamic nature of our society.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Yahaya Iyaka, noted that the University is still adhering to the stamp duty Law, while congratulating NIPOST for the new reform. He promised to present their issues to the Management and that in all certainty they would find a way of benefiting from
