UPHOLD FUTMINNA STANDARD, PROF BALA **URGES NEW STUDENTS**

he Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn has challenged newly admitted students to uphold the enviable record of responsible studentship for which the University is noted.

Prof. Bala gave this charge while delivering his address at the 31st Matriculation Ceremony for the 2017/2018

academic session held yesterday at the Suleimanu Kumo Convocation Square, Main Campus.

He urged them to refrain from unsavoury acts such as examination malpractice, cultism, fighting and drug abuse, amongst others, just as he warned that a breach of the matriculation oath would lead to unceremonious exit from the institution.

Likening their matriculation and stay in the University to a minefield requiring caution and due attention to successfully navigate, he enjoined the new students to study the Student Handbook which serves as a guide.

The VC urged them to bring to bear the training they had received from home as well as primary and secondary schools and to also stay away from people of questionable character.

Prof. Bala also admonished those resident off-campus to respect the values and traditions of their host communities and co-exist peacefully with them.

accommodation challenges of transportation, the VC pleaded for patience and assured that the University Management was working hard to comprehensively address the issues.

He urged them to always channel their concerns to the relevant authorities.

About 13,000 candidates had sought admission in the University, out which 4,472 were offered places. Only

4,339 were finally matriculated.

The event marked Prof. Bala's first Matriculation as the 7th Vice-Chancellor of the University.

The Registrar of the University, Mrs. Victoria Nnawo Kolo administered the matriculation oath on the students.

INVENTOR HONOURS CEFE TRAINS SUG **PROF AKANJI**

n appreciation of his contributions towards the propagation of Secondary School Curriculum, a mobile teaching aid has been presented to the Federal University of Technology, Minna Model School in honour of the former Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji.

The presentation took place yesterday at the FUT, Minna Model School, Bosso Campus.

Speaking during the brief ceremony, the inventor of the equipment, Engr. Lawal Sadiq Suis, a Lecturer in the Department of Mechanical Engineering said the equipment which is targeted at Science Secondary School Students is a Patent Mobile Laboratory which performs different science experiments, especially in physics and chemistry and makes practical workable. The teaching aid, he added, has won several awards in exhibitions and has been used by Kaduna State and El-Amin International School while Kogi State has indicated interest in acquiring the equipment.

The inventor noted that the multifunctional teaching and laboratory kit has gone through rigorous assessment from establishments such as Federal Ministry of Education, Nigeria Educational Research Development Council (NERDC) and many other National and State Educational stakeholders.

He noted that as the secondary school students use the aid, it will be a walk over for them when they become undergraduates and they will be well equipped and sophisticated graduates from

He expressed his appreciation to the former VC for his support towards the success of the invention, hence his being honoured in

Engr. Suis also thanked the Directorate of Research, Innovation and Development (DRID) for being the custodian and for their support.

The Director, DRID, Prof. Hussaini Makun on behalf of the inventor presented the equipment along with the operational manual and monograph in honour of the former VC to the VC for onward delivery to the FUT, Minna Model School to support them in teaching and learning of science, mathematics and basic technology.

The Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn who was represented by Prof. Solomon Oyeleke, Chairman, Staff School Board, while presenting the equipment to the Principal, FUT, Minna Model School described it as unique and space economical.

He urged them to utilise it properly, adding that more will be gotten for the Secondary School to accommodate more students.

The Chairman disclosed that the championship was geared at creating an atmosphere of friendship and togetherness among staff of the University, adding that it would also enable the Sports Committee to spot new talents that would represent the University at the forthcoming Nigerian Universities Staff Games to be hosted by the University of Ilorin.

Dr. Ojutiku disclosed that more games would be introduced during the second edition of the championship to accommodate the female staff of the University and thanked all the participating teams for their enthusiasm.

A colourful and impressive opening ceremony followed, witnessed by large spectators, including staff and students. The high point of the opening ceremony was when all the 16 participating teams filed out to applaud the University Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Bala during the ceremonial march past to usher in the start of sporting hostilities in the University.

Large fans comprising staff, students and members of the University host community cheered as the centre referee's whistle announced the start of the first-ever and the much awaited FUT, Minna Staff Football Championship.

Shortly afterwards, the Vice-Chancellor performed the ceremonial kick-off to signal the start of the curtain raiser. The Vice-Chancellor's Office team kicked off the championship with an emphatic 4-2 win against the University Library team. The match was full of excitement and gusto performance by both teams and lived up to its pre-championship hype.

Words can scarcely describe the ecstasy at the Gidan Kwano Sports Complex on that special day based on the scintillating performance of both teams with fans at the pitch getting more fun than they bargained for before the start of the match.
