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FUTMINNA MATRICULATES 4TH SET **STUDENTS**

he Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn has said that Postgraduate programmes of the University are highly competitive.

He stated this during the 4th matriculation ceremony of the Postgraduate Students held on Thursday, April 12, 2018 at CPES Hall, Bosso Campus.

Prof. Bala said a very high premium is placed on the calibre of students admitted into various programmes of FUT, Minna because they will be reckoned with nationally and internationally. He therefore urged them to work very hard from the onset, having been successfully admitted, to achieve their set academic goals.

"It is not that those who were not admitted were unqualified for the programme of their choice, but the most highly qualified were selected based on available spaces," Prof. Bala said.

The VC urged them to be focused, disciplined, time conscious and be of high moral conduct. He further cautioned them to desist from any form of examination misconduct and involvement in unregistered associations to avoid unpleasant consequences.

Prof. Bala noted that the standard of academic programmes in the University is very high and as a policy, any student whose Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of the second semester of the first year is less than 2.50 for Master and 1.50 for PGD has to discontinue the programme.

He advised them to see their research supervisors frequently as there is a stipulated time frame for the respective programmes which must be adhered to.

The VC encouraged them to acquaint themselves with the Postgraduate School prospectus as well as participate in the newly formed Association of Nigerian Postgraduate Students (ANPS), FUT, Minna Chapter.

Prof. Bala disclosed that a total of 3,064 candidates applied to the University but only 1,735 were admitted out of which 1,244 registered.

Rabiu Ibrahim, a Postgraduate Student, studying Masters in Analytical Chemistry in an interview commended FUT, Minna for its high academic standard.

"I intend to be a lecturer and researcher to contribute my quota to the socio-economic development of the country and FUT, Minna is the right place for researchers; the future and prospect is very high here. I am glad to be here," Rabiu echoed.

The Registrar of the University, Mrs. Victoria Nnawo Kolo administered the matriculation oath on the students.

VC LAYS FOUNDATION FOR PG STUDENT SECRETARIAT

n view of the need to provide a befitting space for their official activities and relaxation for Post Graduate Students, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, *fsssn* has laid the foundation for the building of a secretariat for the Association of Nigerian Post Graduate Students, FUT, Minna Chapter.

The foundation laying took place on Monday, April 9, 2018 at the project site, beside the Security Office, Main Campus.

Speaking during the event, the Vice-Chancellor said, yet again, FUT, Minna is trailblazing at it is the first of its kind, adding that in most schools, there is hardly any room for postgraduate classes talk more of relaxation centre.

"As matured students, the kinds of things postgraduates do or need to do will be a bit different from what the undergraduates do. Therefore, providing them a secretariat and relaxation spot is a good and welcomed initiative," Prof. Bala opined.

The VC said Management is happy with it and supports it. He noted that from the design, it is going to be a great edifice, which will give a beautiful scenery to people as it will be one of the first edifice they will see as they come into the University.

He expressed his appreciation to the Dean of PG School, Prof. Matthew Musa Kolo over the development.

Prof. Bala said after the PG Board sits, there should be the introduction of development levy on the students that could be used to plough into building of the secretariat and help in its continued growth. The helmsman supported the building with an initial contribution of one million naira only.

In a presentation before the foundation laying, the project Architect, Dr. Adedayo Olatunde, Department of Architecture, disclosed that the building is divided into the administrative sections, comprising six offices for the executives while the guest house section comprises of a relaxation lounge for PG Students to relax when they don't have lectures.

According to him, it also has a store, kitchen and courtyard that links the two buildings. The site also

allows them to have a lot of out door activities for relaxation. The idea of the guest section is for running and maintenance from money generated from it.

Earlier in his speech, the Interim President, Postgraduate Student Association, FUT, Minna, Saheed Mustapha expressed his appreciation to the University Management for endorsing and giving the association the opportunity to build its secretariat, adding that the project would not be abandoned.

He said the goal of the association is to ensure that the secretariat provides support and fosters unity among Postgraduate Students and that he is committed to providing transparency in order to ensure an effective functioning of the Association.

In her vote of thanks, the General Secretary of the Association, Halimah Tauheed on behalf of all Postgraduate students thanked the University Management for their continued support and advice towards taking the association to greater heights.

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COMMUNITY RESEARCH GROUP TO USE ICT CONGRATULATES NEW HELMSMAN SEXUAL HEALTH INFOR **BOSSO**

n furtherance of the Vice-Chancellor's drive towards community service, the Technology and Development Research Network (TADREN) in the School of Information and Communication Technology (SICT), has kick-started efforts aimed at addressing adolescent sexual health issues in Bosso Local Government area of Niger State.

This much came to the fore when Ag. Dean of SICT and leader

of the group, Prof. Nicholas Iwokwagh made a presentation to community leaders and officials of the Primary Health Care Unit of the LGA on Tuesday, April 10, 2018 at Conference Room of the Local Government Headquarters, Maikunkele.

Prof. Iwokwagh disclosed that TADREN was determined to see a change that would lead to the protection of sexual and reproductive rights and health of adolescent boys and girls and ensure that they have access to adolescent-friendly sexual health service delivery. The target group for the intervention are people between the ages of 12 and 24, he added.

Acting Dean disclosed that TADREN would help the community use ICT to drive change, just as it is out to translate research findings into reality.

He reiterated the need for parents to talk openly with their children on sexual health matters as studies have shown that parents who do so tend to have well prepared children who cannot be sexually exploited.

Part of the role of primary health care, Prof. Iwokwagh said, was to ensure that whatever technology is used must be within the ability of the community to use and effectively maintain.

The don disclosed that studies on adolescent sexual reproductive health situation in Nigeria indicate that adolescents account for 60% HIV/AIDS cases, 80% of abortions and abortion-related complications in Nigeria as well as a birthrate of 112 in 1000, one of the highest in the world.

He identified individual, cultural, economic, social and religious factors as predictors of the adolescent sexual and reproductive health situation in the society.

In his remarks, the Director, Primary Health Care in the LGA, Mall. Hassan Bosso, said that they were impressed with presentation and gave assurances of cooperating with Prof. Iwokwagh towards success of the intervention.

TADREN has as its vision "to engage in cutting head academic and applied research for the purpose of finding lasting solutions to the multifarious problems confronting our society" and a mission of engaging "ICT and innovative research approaches to drive development and social change in Nigeria."

Its research directions include media technologies and social change; ICT and healthcare; ICT, development and poverty reduction, amongst others.
