Speaking earlier, the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, FSSSN said the visit was to thank the Governor for all the efforts and support given during the transition and equally brief him on the forthcoming 27th Convocation Ceremony. highlighted the activities lined up for the event, and solicited for Government's assistance in the repairs of the road leading to the Main Campus, among others.

"This year's convocation ceremony is special in many respect as it is going to be the first under the new set of the University Governing Council led by Prof. 'Femi Odekunle; the first under my watch as the Vice-Chancellor and last for the Registrar." Prof. Bala noted.

In the area of collaboration, the VC said even though the institution is owned by the Federal Government, the University should be seen doing a lot for the State Government. He expressed his belief that there are so many things the state and the University can do together.

He further stated that the University had developed some proposals with the UN-Habitat in respect of some projects especially the Smart City Project coming up in Suleja. The University, according to him can also collaborate with the State in the areas of housing and agriculture.

Also, as part of its corporate social responsibility, the VC said the University is currently training eight (8) secondary schools, within the state on ICT. The idea, is to expose the students to the rudiments of ICT so that they will be able to meet up with today's global ICT needs.

## 27TH CONVOCATION PRESS BRIEFING

FUTMinna To Graduate 3,741, As 62 Bag First Class

arring any last minutes change of plans, come February 1, 2018, the Federal University of Technology, Minna will be graduating 3,741 students for the 2016/2017 academic session out of which 62 bagged first class honours.

This information was disclosed by the Vice-Chancellor of the

University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, FSSSN yesterday during a press briefing ceremony to herald activities for the 27th convocation ceremony and 35th Founder's day of the institution held at the Senate Chamber, Main Campus.

Prof. Bala stated that 1,006 students bagged Second Class Upper Division, 1,526 finished with Second class lower division, 468 earned Third class degrees while the remaining 34 finished with Pass degrees.

He further revealed that out of the 3,741 students that will be graduating, 3,096 will receive first degrees, 426 will be awarded Master's degrees while 46 will bag PhDs. The remaining 173 will be awarded postgraduate diplomas.

'The graduands are from the Schools of Agriculture and Agricultural Technology, Environmental Technology, Engineering and Engineering Technology, Entrepreneurship Technology, Management Information and Communication Technology, Life Sciences, Physical Sciences, Science and Technology Education and two of our affiliate institutions; Federal College of Education (Technical), Akoka and Kaduna Polytechnic, Kaduna, the VC stated.

The Vice-Chancellor informed the pressmen that the convocation activities would commence on Friday, January 26, 2018 with a special Jumma't service at both campuses by 1: 15pm, which will be followed by a special church service by 8:30 am on Sunday, 28th January, 2018 at the Chapel of Grace.

He disclosed that the Convocation Lecture titled: Nigeria: 'The Travails of an Animal Kingdom' will be delivered by an eminent professor of Law, Prof. Sagay Itsejuwa Esanjumi, SAN, who is the Chairman, Presidential Advisory Committee Against Corruption at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus on Wednesday by 3:00 pm.

The don intimated the pressmen that the second phase of the School of Agriculture and Agricultural Technology building will be flagged off by the Executive Secretary of the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund), Dr. Abdullahi Bichi Baffa on Wednesday, January 31, 2018 by 9:00 am at the Main Campus while the grand event which is the convocation ceremony would be on Thursday, February 1, 2018 at the Suleimanu Kumo Convocation Square where first degrees,

higher degrees, postgraduate diplomas as well as award of prizes would be conferred on graduands.

He commended the journalists for their timely and accurate reportage of the University events while looking forward for more robust coverage of the convocation ceremony and other events of the institution.

Delivering the vote of thanks, the Chairman, University Ceremonies Committee who is also the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Yahaya Iyaka thanked the journalists for making out time to honour the University's invitation and solicited for their continuous support during and after the convocation ceremony.

#### PROF IWOKWAGH TO **ENHANCE SICT VISIBILIT**

Prof. Iwokwagh who disclosed this, as part of his action plan,
