FUTMINNA WINS MINISTRY OF **RESEARCH GRANT**

hree lecturers from the Department of Geology, Federal University of Technology, Minna have won a nine million naira research grant of the Federal Ministry of Mines and Steel Development.

Former Head of the Department, Dr. Idris-Nda Abdullahi (lead researcher) along with two of his colleagues, Dr. Nuhu

Waziri and Dr. Thomas Ako won the grant for a collaborative work titled: "Geological Mapping and Assessment of Metallic and Industrial Minerals in Parts of North Central Nigeria (FCT, Kaduna, Nasarawa and Niger States)."

In an address during the presentation of the awards which took place yesterday at Abuja in the Conference Room of the Ministry. The Minister of State, Hon. Abubakar Bawa Bwari disclosed that the occasion marked the first time ever that the Ministry was having such a research collaboration with Nigerian tertiary institutions. He expressed delight over the development and assured that it would be sustained.

The minister further disclosed that a total of 84 million naira was disbursed among 11 universities that won the grants and urged the benefitting institutions to stick to the terms of reference of the awards and complete the work within six months as stipulated.

Hon Bwari said the universities won the grants based on the merit of their proposals and the potential to develop the mining sector.

He said the release of the funds for research development and collaboration to benefitting universities will increase the geosciences data available for investors in mining sector.

Hon. Bwari expressed hope that the effort will help improve the quality of learning by impacting on the students and lecturers that would be involved in field work.

The minister disclosed that following the signing of the 2018 budget, the second phase of the collaboration will soon commence, adding that the ministry intends to, in

future, increase the amount available for each research and further narrow the areas of study in order to deepen the actualization of its roadmap.

He called on tertiary institutions in the country to collaborate with the ministry to give Nigeria a befitting place on the mining world map.

Earlier in his remarks, Chairman of the Ministry's Steering Committee, Prof. Olugbenga Okunola disclosed that proposals were received from 15 Nigerian universities, screened by the committee comprising five professors and 11 were found to be relevant to Mining Sector Roadmap.

He said that on completion of the studies, a peer review exercise will follow.

The Director, Research, Innovations and Development of FUT, Minna, Prof. Hussaini Makun received the award letter on behalf of the University.

Speaking with Campus News after the event, the lead researcher Dr. Abdullahi, said they had put in a lot of effort to ensure that their proposal was one of the best in the area they intend to work.

He expressed happiness that their efforts were crowned with success and gave assurances that they would study expeditiously to complete the work within the time limit.

A breakdown of the awards shows that other universities that won the same amount of grant with FUT, Minna are: Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria; Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife; University of Nigeria, Nsukka and Ibrahim Badamasi Babangida University (IBBU), Lapai.

University of Ibadan, University of Lagos, University of Port Harcourt, Nasarawa State University and Ebonyi State University all won grants worth N6.5 million each.

Responding on behalf of the benefitting institutions, Vice-Chancellor of IBBU, Prof. Nasiru Maiturare described the event as a landmark and enjoined other ministers to follow suit in the direction of collaborating with Nigerian universities.

He said that the event has given life to Nigeria's quest for diversification and development of its mineral deposits, just as it amplifies the federal government's drive for local content.

Prof. Maiturare thanked the minister for recognising the talents and patronising the resources in Nigerian universities in order to develop the country's economy. He assured that the universities would deliver the assignments beyond the expectations of the ministry

It may be recalled that the FUT, Minna had last year received a reconnaissance permit and exploration licence issued by the Nigerian Mining Cadastre Office.

NIESV COLLABORATES WITH FUTMINNA

he Chairman of the Plant and Equipment Valuation Faculty of the Nigerian Institution of Estate Surveyors and Valuers (NIESV) Mr. Osato Osawaye in the company of delegates from Estate Surveyors Registration Board of Nigerian (ESVARBON) and Niger State Chapter of NIESV has visited the Federal University of Technology, Minna.

The visit took place on Wednesday, July 4, 2018 at the Vice Chancellor's Conference Room, Main Campus.

Mr. Osawaye while briefing the Vice-Chancellor of the University. Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, represented by the Dean, Postgraduate School, Prof. Matthew Kolo said the visit was in pursuance of collaboration with the University to have an international workshop, training and course in conjunction with NIESV, ESVARBON and the Federal Ministry of Mines and Steel Development.

According to him, there is a seriousness of the present government in the area of diversification of our economy and one of the quickest turn around product naturally given to us by the Almighty is our abundant reserves of mineral resources hence the need for us to go back to the business of growing the mining industry.

The Chairman disclosed that the synergy between NIESV and the Federal Ministry of Mines and Steel Development is in terms of developing capacity in the practice, development and exploitation of our mines, mineral assets and steel industry hence the need for the international conference.

"We lack capacity among the professionals that are engaged in the field of valuation; we need to grow their competencies which will prevent foreign investors from importing human capital," he stressed.

Mr. Osawaye said Niger State was deemed fit for the international workshop because it is like an abstract of Nigeria comprising of various cultures, also because the Minister of Mines is from Niger State and charity begins at home. He pointed out that FUT, Minna was chosen as the certificate awarding university that will work with NIESV towards enhancing the competency of the Nigerian valuer to provide expert valuation services to the myrid of investors that are trying to gate crash into our economy to take a chunk of the mining industry we have opened our borders to.

He disclosed that the proposed date for the conference which is going to be the first of its kind is November and looked forward to the University hosting it.

Responding, the VC expressed appreciation for the honour given to the University, describing it as a welcome development.

The helmsman said collaboration is part of the University activity and will be delighted to host the workshop, while assuring them that the University has the capacity, resource and serene environment to host an international workshop of that magnitude.

The VC encouraged them to prepare very well for an impressive conference within the time frame so as to give a good first impression, adding that there is no doubt that the conference will be a pleasant outing with the credible members from the Ministry of Mines and Steel Development, NIESV ESVARBON and Departments of Estate Management and Evaluation and Geology of FUT, Minna.
