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PROF IYAKA DELIVERS INAUGURAL LECTURE Offers Scholarships, Endowment Chemistry Students

he Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Yahaya Ahmed Iyaka yesterday took the centre stage when he delivered the 66th Inaugural Lecture of the University.

However, in addition to getting to know the don's contributions to knowledge, the audience got to witness

his sense of giving back to society.

The capacity-filled Caverton Lecture Theatre, venue of the lecture at the Gidan Kwano Campus, erupted in applause, when Iyaka who is a professor of Analytical Chemistry, in what will go down as the first of its kind in the University, announced that he is instituting a scholarship, with effect from the end of the 2017/2018, for the best 100 Level student of Niger State origin in Chemistry Department.

Prof. Iyaka who disclosed that the scholarship is his own way of giving back to the state, having benefitted from the state government scholarships during his secondary and university education, assured that he would fund the scholarship throughout his life time.

The scholarship will cover school fees of the beneficiary up to final year, a situation that would eventually amount to having four beneficiaries per session.

He also announced the endowment of a prize for the best overall graduating student of the Department of Chemistry. The endowment, worth N500 thousand in perpetuity, is in honour of his father, late Alh. Muhammad Ibrahim Iyaka.

In the lecture titled: "The Fascinating Elements of Soils: Are You Seeing What I Am Seeing?," Prof.

Iyaka disclosed that his research was centred on urban surface soils due to his interest in anthropogenic input of trace metals into soils, and their possible effects on plants, animals and humans through the food chain.

He submitted that lecturers have the onus to make their institutions serve the direct needs of society instead of being mere citadels of abstract learning.

Frowning at the ambiguity surrounding the training of technologists in the country, which he said has in turn led to the problems of inefficiency and equity, he called for a re-definition of their role and significance.

For the country to have research products worthy of universal patent, the DVC recommended establishment of standard laboratories with state-of-theart equipment and well trained technologists in each geopolitical zone.

To achieve an environmentally safe nation, he stressed the need for constant monitoring on levels of heavy metals in urban soils, with a view to assessing their potential risks to life and environment.

In his remarks, Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof, Abdullahi Bala fsssn thanked dignitaries from different parts of the country for attending the lecture.

Three former Vice-Chancellors of FUT, Minna -Professors Muhammad Daniyan OFR, Muhammed Salihu Audu FMAN and Musbau Adewumi Akanji FAS amongst many other eminent personalities attended the Inaugural Lecture.

"She was my long lost student at ABU, Zaria recently discovered. Whoever knew her either as a student or in the course of her career, when you hear about her will be proud to be associated with her due to her sterling qualities as someone with high integrity, honesty, transparency and humility. I want to say that we're very proud to be associated with her," Prof. Odekunle said, amidst cheers.

In his goodwill message, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, said he first worked closely with Mrs. Kolo when he was Director of CPES and that gave him an insight of the kind of person she is. He said she cherishes loyalty especially from the registry staff and she also has shown absolute loyalty to the University.

"The competence and confidence she exhibited in managing crisis situations in the University shows her strength and abilities. I've enjoyed working with her and have learnt a lot from her, as such we cannot thank her enough for all her sacrifices and meritorious services to the university and humanity at large. We also thanked the husband for allowing her work for the University, especially in the last six years as Registrar where she had to spend long hours in the office," Prof. Bala stated.

Earlier, goodwill message from an external member of council, Barrister Alabi Gaffar Babatunde expressed happiness for the former Registrar's successful tenure in office. He described her as a great woman of repute with wealth of experience worthy of emulation. He mentioned some of her good qualities to include:

knowledge, hard work, diligence, team work and Godliness among others, while calling on her subordinates to imbibe such qualities for a successful carrier.

On the other hand an internal member of Council and Dean, School of Electrical and Engineering Technology (SEET), Engr. Prof. Elizabeth Onwuka said Mrs. Kolo is a woman that everybody should celebrate because she has achieved both at home and in office. According to her, she worked tirelessly to protect the system by putting in place policies that have improved the system, especially in the areas of transcript and certificate issuance.

The Director, Directorate of Collaboration Affiliations and Linkages (DCAL) Prof. Emmanuel Udensi who spoke on behalf of the University Senate reaffirmed that throughout her six years tenure as Secretary to Senate she ensured prompt Senate meetings; once in a month and that the quality of the minutes have greatly improved. "Senate is indeed grateful to her," he said.

Speaking on behalf of the Registry Department, Hajiya Aisha Ndayako, Deputy Registrar and Secretary, SEET described Mrs. Kolo as open minded, professional in her dealings who gave her subordinates ample opportunity to learn and excel while wishing her the best.

Responding with a bitter-sweet memory the former Registrar expressed her gratitude to Council, Senate, staff - particularly staff of the Registry Department-for the support and cooperation. She also showed her joy to have served under three Vice-Chancellors namely: Prof. Muhammed Salihu Audu, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji and the incumbent Prof. Abdullahi Bala, adding that words could not express her gratitude to them as well as all the Principal Officers under these three regimes.

"I am highly overwhelmed by this honour. I did not expect an event of this magnitude, I did not know that I deserve all these but I just want to say I'm very, very grateful. Thank you very much. The result of what I have achieved today is not for me alone but that of Registry and I call on all Registry staff to extend equal support and cooperation to the new Registrar, Mr. Amos Kolo," she said.

Mrs. Kolo also called on Registry staff to work round the clock to ensure that records are kept straight as "no Registry, no University," as the slogan goes.
