PROF GANA DELIVERS 64TH INAUGURAL **LECTURE**

rof. Andrew Saba Gana of the Department of Crop Production has stated that plants generally have defence mechanism that are based on prevention, tolerance or resistance.

Prof. Gana spoke yesterday when he presented the 64th Inaugural Lecture of the University titled: Plants'

Coping Strategies: Nature's Gift for Sustainable and Safe Food Production, held at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus.

"These defence mechanisms are activated in different ways, depending on the type of insect pest or disease attacking the plant," he explained.

The Professor of Crop Production mentioned that, plant disease and insect pests could be a threat to food sufficiency and security which could bring a nation to a standstill, thereby weakening its economy and security architecture.

The don further explained that to counter pest attack, plants produce specialised morphological structure or secondary metabolites and proteins that have toxic, repellent or anti-nutritional effects on the pest.

"Host plant resistance could be incorporated into other pest control strategies without adverse effect on the environment and human life. The drive for selfsufficiency could not be sustained for a long period if adequate measures are not taken to breed for resistant genes. This drive must be pursued against the backdrop of discouraging abuse and misuse of chemicals to control pest," he reiterated.

Highlighting his contribution to knowledge, Prof. Gana observed that landraces had higher percentage of resistance genes than both the farmers' and improved varieties.

According to him, resistant genes when exploited could drive the nation towards sustainable self-sufficiency in food production and that genes for resistance to diseases and insect pest can rightfully be considered as one of the most important natural resources determining the survival of the human race.

He recommended the quantification of the economic impact of major plant diseases in Nigeria as this would enhance adequate planning for pest control, while calling for the distribution of free or subsidized resistant crop seed inputs to farmers.

"Continuous monitoring of border effect along the Nigerian borders in order to check pest and disease incidence in States that are along the Nigerian border,"

Food safety regulation, he said, especially on agricultural products should be taken seriously by the government and that there should be a regulatory body on agricultural commodities that specifically addresses safety issues.

In his address, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, thanked the lecturer for his well-researched lecture, stating that inaugural lecture is a presentation of Professors to both town and gown and that both sides were well represented at the lecture.

Prof. Bala appreciated dignitaries who attended the lecture and wished them journey mercies back to their respective destinations.

CSSP PAYS VISIT TO VC

embers of the Community Safety Security Partnership (CSSP) have paid a courtesy visit to the Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna.

Speaking during the visit, which took place on Monday, May 28, 2018 at the Vice-Chancellor's Conference

Room, Main Campus, the Chairman CSSP, Chief Toni Joseph said the aim of the visit was to officially welcome congratulate the Vice-Chancellor on appointment.

Chief Joseph solicited for Management assistance in tackling security challenges around the University, adding that the University community is a direct beneficiary of students presence.

The Chairman revealed that the Police vehicles have been out of use for sometimes and when the vehicle was in use members of CSSP used to contribute money to fuel the vehicle to carry out its operations.

He appealed to the Vice-Chancellor to look into the issue of amount being charged by the University for deferment, adding that many parents find it difficult to raise the money for their wards as a result of nonpayment of salaries by some State governments.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, *fsssn*, thanked them for their interest in the stability of the University.

Prof. Bala pointed out that the population of the University students is over twenty-two thousand and only about four thousand live in the school premises and it is the concern of Management to ensure that the students live in harmony with the members of the University community.

The VC said that discipline among the students is a major factor for peace and harmony and indiscipline leads to chaos, saying that the University has zero tolerance for indiscipline.

"The target of the Management is to have 70% of the student live in the school premises to enable them interact with one another," Prof. Bala disclosed.

On the issue of selective prosecution, the VC said that any student found wanting will be dealt with appropriately.

"There are committees set up to deal with students misconduct in the University and students discipline is always handled at the highest level. There can never be selective justice in dealing with students no matter where you come from," he stated.

On the issue of payment of school fees, the VC said students were given sufficient time and the Management bent backwards to accommodate them by extending the portal closure to allow more students to register.

"Some students collected money and spent it hoping to get another before payment," he revealed.

"Students should know that their first responsibility is to pay their fees, to do their registration. Students who are not able to pay their fees before the portal is closed are advised to apply for deferment because there is no way the portal can be opened. If you do that, the student will take it for granted," he said.

The VC assured members of CSSP that there request would be looked into by Management while noting that they are partners in progress.

UHS GETS NHIS ACCREDITATION

atisfied with the health care facilities on ground at the University health Services (UHS), Federal University of Technology, Minna, the National Health Insurance Scheme (NHIS) has approved the UHS accreditation as primary and secondary health care provider in the NHIS Social Health Insurance Scheme.

Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, yesterday at the Council Chamber, Main Campus on behalf of the Executive Secretary, NHIS, the State Coordinator, NHIS, Adamu Abdullahi said the validity of the accreditation is for two years after which the clinic is expected to re-apply.

He advised the University to abide by the operating principles contained in the NHIS guidelines and that the scheme accredited Health Maintenance Organisations (HMOs) will contact the University for the signing of the agreements, while congratulating the University, he expressed hope for continued collaboration between the University and NHIS in providing accessible and qualitative health care services to not just staff and students of the institution but outsiders too.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Bala said the Management is satisfied by the new state of the University Health Services as an accredited health provider. "It is to the advantage of the institution to have this state because the University today is like a small town with a student population of about twenty-two thousand in addition to the staff population of four thousand," he reiterated.

He thanked NHIS for granting UHS accreditation and congratulated the Director, USH, Dr. Taofeek Uthman for his efforts in seeing that the clinic is accredited, while saying the next line of action is to sensitize the University community on the need for them to register with the Clinic as their health care provider.
