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WE MUST BRING IN TECHNOLOGY TO COMBAT INSECURITY – PROF BALA

or Nigeria to surmount its present security challenges, technology must be brought into the operations of its Armed Forces, the Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, **fsssn**, has said.

Prof. Bala said this yesterday when he received the new Commander of Headquarters, Training and Doctrine

Command, Nigerian Army (HQ TRADOC) Minna, Maj. Gen. Adeku Salihu who paid him a courtesy visit in his office.

The Vice-Chancellor observed that the present situation where the military is involved in internal security operations in many states shows that the solution is beyond having boots on the ground across the country, hence the need to bring in technology.

He expressed happiness over the visit, adding that the University looks forward to carrying out demand-driven researches for the Armed Forces, just as he pointed out that the essence of the institution was to give effect to the nation's desire for self-reliance in science and technology.

Prof. Bala gave assurances of the University's readiness to collaborate with TRADOC which is the think-tank of the Nigerian Army.

Earlier, the TRADOC Commander, Maj. Gen. Salihu, said that the formation under his command would like to take advantage of its proximity to the University to enhance collaboration between both parties.

He said the military recognises the centrality of research and development in today's warfare, hence the need for the collaboration.

Gen. Salihu who attested to the high quality of

graduates produced by the University, recalling that when, in his former capacity as Chief of Communication at Defence Headquarters, he was tasked to start a research team for the Armed Forces, he discovered that most of the manpower engaged for that purpose were alumni of FUT, Minna.

In a related development, the Vice-Chancellor has called on the Nigerian Police to show diligence and do their job in the best interest of the society and within the ambits of the law.

He stated this yesterday when the Area Commander, Bosso, ACP Abiodun Onuoha paid him a courtesy visit in his office.

Prof. Bala pointed out that in most cases, the University interactions with Police are associated with negative events. He said maintaining a close working relationship in crime-related problems will help keep crime down and students will be more comfortable in situations involving Police.

The VC said, Police are partners in progress and that it is important that they understand the unique need of the University community to make our campuses safer. He particularly thanked the Area Commander for the visit.

Speaking earlier, ACP Abiodun pledged to maintain a very strong commitment to campus safety and security. He further solicited for a cordial working relationship with the University. "If we work with you and you work with us, students and staff will feel safer when they are on campus and we will be happy that we are doing our job," he stated.

LEARN, SHARPEN YOUR PRACTICAL SKILLS, VC CHARGES IT STUDENTS

he Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, **fsssn**, has charged the 400 Level students of the University due for the 2018 Students' Industrial Work Experience Scheme (SIWES) to be willing to learn and work to broaden their practical skills.

The Vice-Chancellor, represented by the Dean, School of Agriculture and Agricultural Technology (SAAT), Prof. Reuben Kolo, gave this charge during the 2nd and 3rd Phases of

Orientation Exercise for 400 Level Students of the University held on Thursday 10th and Friday 11th May, 2018 at the University Auditorium, Main Campus and Lecture Theater 2, Bosso Campus respectively.

He noted that the primary objective of SIWES is to learn, which should be the students foremost priority rather than focusing or looking for organisations where they could be paid. He urged them to use the opportunity of the training to gain more experience and advised them to adhere to instructions and desist from any form of thuggery in their places of attachment.

Prof. Bala thanked the Industrial Training Fund (ITF) for their training, adding that over the years they have maintained competency.

In her presentation, the Minna Area Manager, ITF, Barr. (Mrs.) Ifeoma Ihezue said the essence of the training was for the students to gain some practical work experience in addition to the theoretical aspect of their course of study. This, she said, will give them a better understanding of what they are studying and help them perform better after graduation.

The Area Manager urged them to attach themselves in places that are relevant to their courses of study and urged them to make good use of the opportunity as some students in the past have gotten employment based on their excellent performance during IT.

Barr. Ihezue emphasized the need for the students to be safety concious, especially when handling machines and equipment. She also charged them to supply the right information and documentation to avoid issues during payment by ITF.

The Head of Training, ITF, Minna, Mr. Joe Sale Aruwa, while shedding more light on the scheme, spoke on the history of ITF, its functions and challenges and told the students to be good ambassadors of FUT, Minna in their places of attachment by obeying rules and regulations of the organisations, being punctual, honest, diligent and respectful.

The SIWES Officer, ITF, Mal. Mohammed Abdulrasheed in his presentation explained to the students the documents they will use before, during and after the SIWES.

Speaking earlier, the Director, Industrial Liaison Office, Prof. Jonathan Yisa, advised the students to use the SIWES period to learn and urged them to be of good behaviour.

Prof. Yisa thanked the Vice-Chancellor and ITF staff for making the orientation a success. He added that from this session, SIWES earns the students two credit unit for those going for six months while those going for nine months and above will earn three credit unit.

Questions bordering on the scheme were answered by the ITF Area Manager and Director, Industrial Liaison Office.

The SIWES commences on May 28, 2018.

The next time you are filling the space for a next-of-kin, write down the name of your closest blood relation to be referred to about you, whether while you are alive or no more and while you remain healthy or become needy. Beware! Choosing a next-of-kin isn't another expression of friendship, love, favour or sympathy. Do that with diligence.
