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PROF OKUNADE TASKS FG ON ADEQUATE **FUNDING OF EDUCATION**



Prof. Okunade deliver his lecture

rof. Shittu Kelani Okunade has called on the Federal Government of Nigeria to adequately fund education in order to become a reading nation.

The Professor of English made this call on Thursday, November 1, 2018 while delivering the 69th Inaugural Lecture of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus.

In the lecture titled: "Reading Nations Are Leading Nations: Whither Nigeria." Prof. Okunade disclosed that Nigeria is no where to be found on the league of reading nations, this he attributed to its poor reading culture.

He called on government at all levels

philanthropists to massively fund education through the provision of well equipped libraries, educational facilities, book development centres, workshops to equip teachers at all levels and advocacy on reading should be included in school curriculum.

The don stated that government should place emphasis on primary education because, it is the foundation of formal education and where the foundation of life long reading culture is laid. However, there is the need for primary school teachers in particular to be well grounded in the methodology of teaching pupils how to

The lecturer who urged parents to provide reading materials for their wards, re-echoed that they have a major role to play in inculcating reading culture in their children.

According to him, with the joint efforts of the school, family, libraries, publishers, booksellers, mass media and government, the desired to improved reading habit in children and youth will be created which will enable Nigeria to engage in global competitiveness and join the league of leading nations.

In his address, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, congratulated the Lecturer for his beautiful presentation, adding that the message from the lecture was for all in their different ways to promote reading culture in their families and communities , which will go a long way in making them enlightened.

DIRECT PAYMENT OF TUITION FEES TO FOREIGN INSTITUTIONS / TETFUND SCHOLARSHIP **ACADEMIC STAFF**

ertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) has resolved to pay its oversea Scholars tuition fees directly into their institutions' bank accounts with effect from 2018 academic session for Master, Doctorate and Bench work Scholars.

In the same vein, the Fund has further stated that starting from the last quarter of 2018, submissions will no longer be considered from Academic staff Training without the financial details of the foreign institution of studv.

Consequently, eligible applicants should ensure to include the following while making submission for their study fellowship:

- Foreign Beneficiary institution's name and full
- ii. Foreign Beneficiary institution's bank name;

- iii. Foreign Beneficiary institution's account number;
- iv. Foreign Beneficiary institution's bank swift code;
- v. Foreign Beneficiary institution's bank address,
- vi. Currency of Payment;
- vii. Full payment Details; and
- viii. Foreign Beneficiary institution's country code.

Any nomination for foreign Scholarship that does not include these information will be deemed incomplete and will not be processed for TETFund sponsorship.

In addition, Scholarship for Academic Staff Training (Foreign) will be processed by the Fund twice only within an intervention year i.e. June and November only. Therefore, eligible applicants should ensure that his/her application is considered by the Committee of Deans at least one (1) month before the due date.

DEPT OF ENTRPRENEURSHIP UNDERGOES NUC ACCREDITATION

n a bid to ensure that universities comply with its benchmark in the running of undergraduate programmes in the country, the National Universities Commission (NUC) accreditation team has assessed the institution's Entrepreneurship Business Studies programme.

Speaking on Monday, October 29, 2018 at the Main Campus, the Chairman of the team, Prof. Bayero Muhammed from Usmanu Danfodio University, Sokoto said they were in the institution to check the strength and weaknesses of the Entrepreneurship and Business Studies Department.

Prof. Muhammed disclosed that what the team requires is the minimum standard and once they have been met, full accreditation would be given.

The Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, while receiving the team said Management is very committed in ensuring they had a hitch free assessment.

Presenting the team's preliminary report, Muhammed expressed satisfaction with the curriculum, staffing, physical facilities and financing. He advised the department of the need to have a well-equipped oncampus skills acquisition centre while acknowledging their compliance with NUC guidelines.

A member of the team, Prof. Ellis Idemobi from Anambra State University, Uli in his observation noted that the staff of the department are concerned about the delisting of the School and advised that a lot of advocacy should be carried out to ensure that government does not press on with the policy.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Bala commended the team for a through assignment within 24 hours.

He thanked them for their observations, adding that they would be looked into.

Prof. Bala disclosed that the department has not admitted students in the last two years because of the federal government policy on specialised universities not running management courses.

According to the VC, the issue of delisting has been of great concern to them and they are addressing the issue.

ACCREDITATION TEAM HAILS FUTMINNA FOR PROVISION OF FACILITIES

he National Universities Commission (NUC) panel has accreditation commended the Management of the Federal University of Technology, Minna for providing facilities to run the Information and Management Technology (IMT) programme.

Leader of the panel of assessors, Prof. Justice Emuoyibofarhe gave this commendation during an exit visit to the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, on Saturday, October 27, 2018 at the Bosso Campus of the University.

Prof. Emuoyibofarhe also gave the University the thumb up for its staff development progamme and also made observations on the need for improvement in some areas.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor thanked the accreditation team for the visit and expressed happiness over the observations, saying that the University considers accreditation exercises as avenues to improve on its performance assured that the observations raised would be addressed speedily.

The accreditation exercise involved assessment of the library, studios, laboratories, classrooms as well as an interaction with staff of the department.

DR AMINA ABUBAKAR FLAGS OFF SCIENCE MOBILE TEACHING AID

n view of the need to address the problems of science laboratory equipment, the wife of the State Governor, Dr. Amina Abubakar Bello has flagged off the distribution of science mobile teaching equipment and essential learning materials for secondary schools within the state.

The event took place on Tuesday, October 30, 2018 at Maryam Babangida Girls Science College, Minna.

Speaking during the flag off ceremony, Dr. Bello commended the State government and the Ministry of Education for the laudable project, adding that it was heartwarming, when she found that the funds for the project came solely from the Ministry's savings and Internally Generated Revenue (IGR).

She called on other Ministries, Departments and Agencies to address some of the serious challenges in all the sectors of the State, particularly within the educational and medical sectors.

Dr. Amina noted that public primary schools in the State would soon be renovated by the State government, under the Whole School Approach Development Renovation (WSADR).

Speaking earlier, the Honourable Commissioner for Education, Hajiya Fatima Madugu, commended the administration of Niger State Government for spending more than 3.2 billion naira for the renovation and upgrading of nine secondary schools under its WSADR across the three senatorial zones, including Teacher Professional Development Institute (TPDI), located at Mararaban Dandaudu.

Mrs. Madugu urged the beneficiaries to properly utilize and maintain the items distributed to them.

Giving his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, who was represented by the Deputy Director, Directorate for Research Innovation and Development and Coordinator, Intellectual Policy Technology and Transfer Office, Prof. Moses Olutoye, said the University established has three mandates, namely: research, teaching and community service, because, it was as a result of the teaching effort that brought about the research of the mobile teaching equipment.

He explained that the teaching equipment has gone through so many stages, including patenting, that no one can get it anywhere, without contacting the inventor.

Prof. Bala noted that the project was part of the research mandate, which would help all the secondary schools students to understand science.

He thanked the Niger State Ministry of Education for bringing the product to the community.

Speaking during the ceremony, the Chairman, Niger State House of Assembly Committee on Education, Hon. Bako Alpha, thanked the Hon. Commissioner for proper utilization of IGR in the Ministry to purchased relevant learning materials for schools in the State.

He reiterated that if the same initiative was extended to other ministries, the main organs of government would have less work to do.

Demonstrating the use of the science mobile teaching aid at the event, the inventor, Engr. Lawal Sadiq, a lecturer in the Department of Mechanical Engineering, that the science mobile FUT, Minna explained equipment, aid teaching of science and technology, including mathematics and can also be used at basic and senior levels.

He further revealed that the use of the equipment in teaching help to increase students interest in science subjects and reduce massive failure in examination. He further stated that government spend less in the purchase of equipment.

In his goodwill message, the Chairperson, TPDI, Hajiya Dije Bala, represented by the former Registrar, FUT, Minna, Mal. Muhammad Dattijo Usman said that they came to identify with the very good course of education.

She applauded the effort of the governor for bringing about a turn around in the revitalizing of education with the establishment of Niger State Teachers Professional Development Institute, which is the only body in the country.

During the event, vehicles were also distributed to four girls secondary schools, namely: Maryam Babangida Girls Science College, Minna; Government Girls Science College, Kontagora (Unity); Government Science College, Bida; and Government Secondary School, Tegina.

In his vote of thanks, the permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education, Yahaiya Garba, commended the governor's wife for gracing the occasion.
