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PROF OYERO MAKES CASE FOR IMPROVED POST-HARVEST FISH TECHNOLOGY

Prof. Olusegun Johnson Oyero has called for the adoption of an improved and efficient technology in order to control fish post-harvest losses in Nigeria.

The Professor of Water Resources, Aquaculture and Fisheries Technology made this call today while delivering the 63rd Inaugural Lecture of the Federal University of Technology, Minna at the Caverton Lecture Theatre, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

In the lecture titled: *"Care for Fish Out of Water: A Veritable Post-Harvest Strategy for Food Security in Nigeria,"* Prof. Oyero pointed out that fish post-harvest losses worsen the food and nutrition insecurity and increase the country's reliance on imports, thereby wasting scarce resources.

He called on governments across all levels and nongovernmental organisations to invest in mass production of enclosed drying systems and charcoal-fuelled improved traditional smoking kilns for the use of small scale fish processors.

Prof. Oyero who also stressed the need for product development from fish as it is an important raw material for various industrial usage said such would help in increasing the utilisation of fisheries resources in Nigeria.

Researcher in post-harvest technology should be scaled up, Prof. Oyero recommended, just as he stated the need for a national assessment of losses along the post-harvest chain to enable Fish Post-Harvest Losses (FPHL) researchers to quantify efforts put in curtailing FPHL.

He also recommended the education of fishermen and all stakeholders involved in processing and preservation on the need for proper fish handling practice, adding that providing support facilities such as processing shed at landing sites and markets would help check spoilage.

In the lecture, the don who has conducted extensive research in fish processing and preservation, explained the status of fish production and food security in Nigeria; fish processing technology in Nigeria and post-mortem changes in fish amongst other things. In his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, *fssn* thanked Prof. Oyero for the well presented lecture and acknowledged dignitaries for attending.

SLS ORGANIZES SEMINAR

one-day special seminar was organized by the School of Life Sciences with the theme *"Africayam: A Project to strengthen Yam Breeding in West Africa,"* for members of University staff.

The event took place on Tuesday, March 27, 2018 at Bioinformatics and Medical Imaging Laboratory, Step B Project, Bosso Campus.

In his opening remarks, the Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, *fssn* who was represented by the Dean PG School, Prof. Musa Kolo said it was an exciting thing among colleagues in the academia to interact and be mentored in academic activities.

He also said that what he liked in the seminar is the linkage after the presentation.

Prof. Bala commended the School for organising an educative seminar for members of the University community.

In his presentation, Dr. Patrick Adebola, Project Leader for African Yam, who gave an overview of the importance of yam in West Africa stated that yam featured very well in socio-cultural activities like marriages, thanksgivings and other festivals in the society.

Dr. Adebola further said a population of about three hundred million people consumed yam. This, he said, makes it a very important food in the world, particularly in West Africa, adding that it is also considered a very significant crop in global food security.

He pointed out that about 54 million tones of yam are being produced in Africa and 95% comes from five countries, namely: Nigeria, Benin, Togo, Ghana and Cote D'Ivoire. These countries, according to him, constitute what is called yam belt in terms of production in Africa.

Speaking earlier, the Dean, SLS, Prof. Olamide Falusi expressed his happiness to see that their common dream of raising the standard of the School to international level was gradually becoming a reality.

He encouraged the staff of the School to do more by mobilising their collective strength to add more value to the School and the University in general.

The Dean noted that the lecture has opened up discussions for collaborations.

Giving her vote of thanks, the Deputy Dean of SLS, Dr. Khadiza Lami Mohammed thanked the speaker and wished him safe journey back home.

RCE VISITS FUTMINNA

he Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, *fssn* has assured that the University would take necessary steps to ensure the sustenance of the momentum of activities under the Regional Centre for Expertise on Education (RCE) for Sustainable Development so as to achieve meaningful development.

Prof. Bala gave this assurance when RCE officials paid him a courtesy visit at the University Main Campus, Gidan Kwano today at the Vice-Chancellor's Conference Room.

Prof. Bala thanked them for their initiatives and activities that have been carried out to support education, especially at the basic level. He charged them to sustain the good effort and assured them that the University will go through the documents presented for the purpose of signing a memorandum of understanding MOU.

The Vice-Chancellor further said all 400 Level students are supposed to undergo a minimum of three months Industrial Training (IT) with the belief that it will link the theoretical knowledge with a practical experience in their field of study.

His words: "We have seen so many going to places that are irrelevant to their training. We think that the student industrial experience programme should be realigned in such a way that they will learn in line with what they are studying. We will be using some of the RCE platforms in achieving some of these things. We are also thinking that I.T should also be something that will have nexus with community development, by using the period of I.T to do things that will benefit the community."

Speaking at the occasion, the President African Regional Centres of Expertise (RCEs) and Coordinator of Regional Centre of Expertise (RCE) Minna, Dr. Abdul Husaini said RCE was founded to contribute to the effort of mobilising formal and informal sectors to deliver Education for Sustainable Development (ESD).

He said the major thrust of the ESD is to promote and improve basic education, reorient existing education at all levels, training and retraining and developing of public understanding and awareness of sustainability.

Dr. Hussaini said since he got elected president of RCEs in 2016, they resolved to improve the visibility and focus of RCEs in Africa as hub for solution to local sustainability challenges peculiar to the region.

He disclosed that it is expected that host institutions would bring to bear its expertise in solving local sustainable development challenges that will be shared with other RCEs across the world.

He requested the University to take advantage of its existing structures and programmes to engage in activities that would assist the immediate communities in achieving the target of the SDGs and crown itself as one of the most vibrant RCE host institutions in Africa.
