Chairman, House Committee on Representatives Public Accounts, Hon. (Dr.) Busayo Oluwole Oke has assured the Management, staff and students of Federal University of Technology, Minna, backing in terms of relevant legislations regarding the University.

Hon. Oke gave the assurance during the presentation of the First Annual Lecture of Bursary Department, the University on the "Accountability theme and Transparency in Nigeria: The Role of Accountants," held on Thursday October 21, 2021, at the PTDF Chemical Theatre, Lecture Engineering Complex, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

The lawmaker applauded the University Management for impressively standing out among institutions in terms of submitting University statement of the

account to the appropriate organs at the right time.

In his 18 slides presentation, the guest lecturer dwelt on: The Concept of Accountability, Modes Accountability, Tools Accountability, the Nature of Transparency and Accountability and Transparency in Public Service in Nigeria.

Other sub-topics are: Who is an Accountant?, Ethical Standards required for an Accountant and the Role of Accountants in Accountability Achieving and Transparency in Nigeria

Hon. Oke hinted that Nigeria remains an opportunity asset to the whole world judging from its abundant human and material resources.

The House Committee Chairman elucidated further that even

Nigeria laws frown at corruption, establishment of hence the by structures the Federal Government promote to accountability in governance, among which are:

- 1. Budget Office of the Federation, 2. Financial Reporting Council of Nigeria,
- 3. Bureau of Public Procurement,
- 4. Fiscal Responsible Commission,
- 5. ICPC and EFCC among other regulator Responsible,

however, lamented that despite all the measures taken, recent Transparency International corruption index of 2020 still ranked Nigeria as the 149th most corrupt Country among developing and African countries, scoring only 25 marks evaluation.

Hon. Oke counselled students to take to entrepreneurship after graduation rather than waiting for

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government paid jobs. He also advised the University Management to look for possibility of incorporating entrepreneurship studies into the curriculum.

He noted the peaceful and harmonious relationship existing among members of University community and urged university to continue to work as family, stressing leadership is always ordained by God.

He maintained that everyone is expected to have understanding of the working of accounting policy so as to avoid having grudges with the Bursary Department.

He commended the Bursar and her staff for their remarkable achievements that has created good relationship even up to national level, adding that the National Assembly through his committee is ready to render additional training to the staff of the Department if called upon.

On his part, the Vice Chancellor of the university Professor Abdullahi Bala FSSSN, commended lecturer for the apt, concise and well articulated presentation. He remarked that the organizers of the event had really shopped for a capable hand as guest lecturer.

On the performances of the Bursary Department, Prof. Bala, emphasized that was particularly impressed with the financial management of the Bursar that saved the University from incurring debt during the long COVID-19 period.

The Bursar of the University, Mrs. Hadiza Goje, fcna, fcni, who gave an opening remark at inception of the event, said she felt tremendously honoured welcome the guests that graced the occasion.

She enumerated some innovations she has brought to bear in the Bursary to include: introduction of e- receipts which enable students to print their receipts on-line after

payment; reviewing the in-house Bursary training scheme; establishment of Bursary library and Putting in place strategies for motivating the staff, among others

The highlights of the occasion was the numerous presentations of gifts and awards to both the Guest Lecturer and the University Bursar by the University Management, Senior Staff Association of Nigeria Universities (SSANU) and the Osun State Students Association among other presentation.

Dignitaries at the occasion were the Deputy Chairman, House Committee on Public Accounts, Hon. Abdullahi Abdulkadir Sa'ad and other members of the Committee, including Hon. Usman Hassan Sokodabo, Hon. Shehu Saleh Rijau, Hon. Mark Gbillah Tersser, Hon. Fatoba Olushola, Hon Kunle Olarewaju, Hon. Gbefwi Gaza Jonathan and Ahmadu M. Jatau, among other dignitaries from within the university and other sister institutions in the state.

The Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof Abdullahi Bala FSSSN has flagged off new Stand-Alone Result Computation App (Version III) and its manual as well as Students Mobile App (Version 1.1) developed by the staff of the Information Technology Services (ITS) of the University.

Speaking during the flag off of the softwares on Monday, October 18, 2021 at the NITDA Hub, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano, Prof. Bala said the software version 3.0 is a response to the issues that have been coming up at the result scrutiny and Senate meetings.

The VC commended the efforts of the staff of ITS for developing the software and several others, at no cost to the University.

"One thing I like about ITS is that they do deliver even without I cannot remember us asking. telling them to go and develop version 3.0 to address challenges arising from the older versions but because they are responsive to their duties, they promptly without being told developed this version to address these issues," he noted.

According to him, ITS has been responsive the development of websites and softwares for subunits in the University.

His words: "ITS is one centre that we can say is living up to its responsibilities. In fact, not living up to but living beyond its responsibilities and we are happy with the staff efforts because they make our work a lot easier.

In response to the requests made by the Director, ITS, Prof. Adamu Bala Mohammed, Prof. recognition of the efforts and foresight of the staff of the centre directed both the Chairman of the Committee of Deans and the Registrar to make a special case for ITS staff in terms of training and capacity building.

"Of course for the ITS staff to remain at the top of their game, they need the support of Management and as I said, when you are happy with your child, you go extra mile to encourage the child, we would within our available resources continue to support them in terms of training and other areas of capacity building', he said.

In addition the VC approved an in house training for the users of the software and provision of laptops for Academic Office being the reservoir of all academic results.

In his presentation, the Director, said software ITS the was developed as а result of complaints received from the computation of results and generation of various reports for undergraduate both and postgraduate programmes.

He said the software has passed through major stakeholders within the system for accuracy, efficiency and sustainability. Some of the features of the software include: addressing all reasons stepping down results at scrutiny, fused course registration with additional results, reports computation and generation, user manual and bugs fixed

the Student Mobile App, On version 1.1, he said, it would give students easy access information on their results. payment status and University Campus News as well as enabling parents to monitor their wards progress from the comfort of their homes

Earlier in his welcome address, the Deputy Director, ITS, Dr. Bala Salihu expressed appreciation to the University Management for their support, which has made their work easier.

He noted that the first and second versions of the stand alone result processing software were developed between the years 2000-2002 2010-2012 and respectively.
