The event took place on Thursday, November 24, 2022, at the University Auditorium, Gidan Kwano, where a total of 37 members of staff, received different categories of awards.

In his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof Abdullahi Bala, fsssn recalled that the event did not hold last year due to disruptions.

SERVICOM award, he said, is meant to recognize members of staff who have added value to the mandate of the University, noting that the fact that some have received the award multiple times attests to their value to the system.

Prof. Bala acknowledged that at different stages of his life in the University, he had worked with some of the awardees, hence, there was no surprise that they were given the awards.

The VC who was also honoured with the Grand Award of Excellence for exemplary leadership, project execution and excellence at the event thanked the Focal Officer and staff of SERVICOM Unit for going through the rigorous process of selecting the awardees, maintaining that the system has a way of bringing out those that are adding value to it.

The VC charged the awardees not to regress but rather put in more effort at maintaining high performance, high professionalism and high efficiency, as they have been brought out as models, adding that there is nothing that is self satisfying and self fulfilling than doing their work to the best of their ability and getting the system to appreciate it.

In his address, the SERVICOM Focal Officer, Yusuf Kabiru Adamu said ceremony was organized to publicly recognize and appreciate members of staff of the University who by virtue of their selfless and diligent services have distinguished themselves to the admiration institution and beyond.

he Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Abdullahi Bala fsssn has charged all departments in the University to produce a product that will be available for use in the society in line with his administration's policy, of "One Programme, One Product".

He made the charge on Thursday, November 24, 2022 during the launch of a workshop set up by

the Department of Physics at the Physics Laboratory, Bosso Campus.

Prof. Bala said that the policy was meant to bridge the vacuum which had been created as a result of the neglect of one of the basic functions of a University, noting that, though FUT, Minna had quiet a lot of achievements and strides in research and had performed

marvellously in teaching, producing thousands of graduates and the institution is rated among the top four universities in the country in terms of employability of its products, it seems to have forgotten community service as fundamental mandate.

"The University must wake up and begin to do things that the community will see; tangible products that the University will be associated with. And that is essence of One Programme, the Vice-Chancellor One Product policy," emphasized.

He also stressed the need for effective utilization of knowledge generated through research in order to improve standard of living of the community.

Prof. Bala also enjoined the students to seize the opportunity of having the workshop to acquire skills, stressing that setting up of the workshop and imparting of skills on the students would go a long way in inculcating in them the culture of

entrepreneurship as well as the culture of community development.

The Vice-Chancellor while applauding physics department for breaking the ice in ensuring compliance to the one programme one product policy, also expressed his hope that the students, before leaving the university, would have a product to leave behind as a legacy for the younger generations to see and appreciate.

Speaking earlier in his welcome address, the Head of the Department, Dr. U. Ahmadu said that the workshop is adequately equipped avail students as well as other members of the society the opportunity to acquire skills in electrical/ electronic appliances testing and installation, laboratory equipment maintenance, diagnosis and repair, solar PV power installation and other Electronic devices

He also thanked the Vice-Chancellor for his support and cooperation in ensuring realization of the project.

"Today, Africa's development been has forestalled for a combination of reasons, with the most salient being lack of a strong technology industry, working to transform the continent to a 21st century success." He said.

The Guest Speaker also pointed out that, the 21st century is the fourth industrial revolution, which has ushered in a new wave of technology that has disrupted the present and the future.

Mr. Akano further stated that within the next 30 years, human beings would be competing with super intelligent machines, engineered bodies and algorithms that can manipulate human emotions with embarrassing accuracy.

In his speech, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn expressed his delight over the presentation. Adding that the University is indeed honoured by his presence and advised the students to put whatever they learnt into practice.

He reminded them of their potentials, which needed to be harnessed. Pointing out the need to be problem solvers by identifying a problem and proffering solution.

He thanked the SUG for organising the event and urged them to extend the lesson learnt to other students that were not opportune to attend.

In his words the President of SUG, Amb. Ishaq Yahaya thanked the Speaker, Vice-Chancellor and his Management team for their support and words of encouragement and for being with the students throughout the programme.

FUTMINNA TASJ PARTNER ON **MECHANIZED** FARMING

n a move to actualise the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Federal LUniversity of Technology, Minna and TASJ Concepts Investment Ltd, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn has commissioned an all-year-round farm project with a view to enhancing productivity and complementing the Federal Government efforts in ensuring food security for the Nation.

The project which is geared towards promoting research and development, students' industrial training and practical experience as well as boosting internally generated revenue was officially flagged off on Tuesday, November 22, 2022 at the Farm Site, kilometre 1, Minna - Bida Road, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

Unveiling the project, Prof. Bala enthused that the ceremony was a song of joy, adding that the event brought about self-fulfilment in what the parties had been pursuing in the last three years.

The Vice-Chancellor who disclosed that the University would be celebrating 40 years of its corporate existence by 1st February, next year, stressed the need for maintaining some significant impact especially on the lives of the immediate communities.

"Coming to Minna, you wonder whether there is a university; because, by the time you intermingle with the locals, you hardly find one product that they are using or deploying which emanated from research and development in the University," Prof. Bala lamented.

Stressing the need for a swift step towards correcting the wrongs, the Vice-Chancellor noted that agriculture is one of the quickest ways through which the University can affect the lives of the people in a positive direction by deploying the products of it researches and other technological apparatus which will make farming easier and increase productivity.

While identifying limited resources as the major stumbling block responsible for the non provision of the necessary agricultural equipment, Prof. Bala said that it is logical that we utilize the nationally available infrastructure, both human and material, in order to mobilize resources to achieve mutual benefit of the MoU.

He added that the actualisation of the project will remain a win-win situation not only for the University and it partners but also the community in general.

Speaking earlier at the ceremony, the Managing Director/ Chief Executive Officer of the company, represented by a Consultant, Mr. Tonny Oyewole, expressed the company's determination to bring mechanization to the doorstep of the University community and other neighbouring communities.

Mr. Oyewole who pointed out that some of the challenges the company encountered in its effort to kick off operations in the site allocated include hostility and trespasses by some members of the local community, also appealed to the community heads to sensitize their members on the need to stay away from illegal cultivation and allow the legitimate owners of the land to use it and avert prosecution.

He also assured the readiness of the company in employing the indigenes of the vicinity to work on the farm.

"We are committed to transforming the lives of the University community and the locals who are our neighbours and ensure that our coming to this environment will translate to knowledge, wealth and peace," the MD/CEO assured.

At end of the ceremony, the Vice-Chancellor and his Management team comprising the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Prof. Emmanuel Emeka Udensi' fnip; Registrar, Mr. Amos Nmadu Kolo; Bursar, Mrs. Hadiza Goje' fcna, fcti and the Librarian, Dr. Katamba Abubakar Saka among other dignitaries were led round by the Consultant to inspect some of the equipment already deployed in farm for the kick off of operations.


The equipment were tow Boom sprayers, four double burket planters, a heavy duty plough among others.

It may be recalled that the University and the company signed a MoU in 2019 which provides that while the University would allocate 3,000 hecters of farm land to TASJ, the company on the other hand would ensure the deployment of the needed equipment and man power for the actualization of the project.
