The VC also assured that staff welfare would be pursued vigorously and his leadership will do everything humanly possible to give every staff what they deserve, adding that there will be cause to celebrate at the end as they implement and achieve all the goals of the institution.

As part of the strategy for the global recognition, the VC said the University will not limit itself to accreditation of the National Universities Commission (NUC) but will as well pursue accreditation of various international bodies for its programmes.

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On new appointments he recently approved, Prof. Kuta acknowledged the contributions of occupants of the various offices to the progress of the University, adding that the changes will keep coming as the University is trying to encourage a situation whereby everybody is carried along which is another way of mentoring and making people partake in the governance of the institution ensure equity and fairness. "It is not a one man show, even as the office of the Vice-Chancellor is occupied by one person," he said.

The VC urged all staff to continue to do their best in representing the University wherever they find themselves because posterity will always be at their side.

He urged professors not to relent in mentoring junior academics.

Earlier in their welcome addresses, the Deans of the Schools thanked and appreciated the presence of the Vice-Chancellor and other Principal Officers as they wished him a successful tenure in office.
